of the visit, nor have they been required to assist in entertaining the delegates, individually or as a body.

The Railway authorities disclaim any responsibility with respect to the arrangement of the itinerary. Their brief visit here will complete a tour which has carried them from coast to coast of the Dominion. London trade, was selling at 76 cents. The Haymarket stores issue every Monday morning a catalogue showing exactly what the different products are retailing at for the day and this provides valuable information for checking up on current prices. Mr. Lea stressed particularly the high prices which products can secure on this market if the requirements of the consumer are given first consideration.

Grading and Packing

As an example of the value of careful grading and packing the speaker instanced Virginia apples selling in London at 37 shillings a barrel, as against Nova Scotia apples of apparently equally good quality which were selling at 26 shillings. The dealers explained that the difference was largely due to the faulty packing of the Canadian fruit, pointing out that the head of the barrel, which might seem immaterial to us, was entirely too thick in the Canadian package, and that when removed it showed an apparent shrinkage in the contents, while the American thin package gave a more satisfactory impression. This had a detrimental effect on the price of the Nova Scotia product, even though it was recognized by the British dealers that both types of barrel contained the same cubic inches.

Another drawback the dealers pointed out, was the rougher split hoops on the Canadian barrels, which contrasted unfavorably with the neatly dressed containers used by the American growers. These differences, which to Canadian producers might seem superficial, actually made a difference of about two dollars a barrel, on the British market.
