THE well known trotting stallion Black Pilot, the sire of many speedy horses in the province, is now owned in Moncton by Ezekiel Steeves, who purchased him recently from Nova Scotia parties. Black Pilot was raised on P. E. Island and became famous when he defeated Hernando in a match race for \$500 a side at Summerside, seventeen years ago. Pilot is now about 25 years old and still retains some of the beauty he possessed in his prime. The Pilot-Hernando race still lives in the memory of Islanders, many of whom refer to it as the greatest horse race the island ever saw or is likely to see again. It was not so much noted for the past time, although 229, was very fast for those days, as it was for the rivalry that existed between the friends of the two horses, one of which was owned in Charlottetown and the other in Summerside. Black Pilot was owned in the former named place and the question of breeding was also involved.—Moncton Times.

MONTAGUE Muttart, a well known captain and pilot in the straits between P. E. Island and the mainland, is in the city, the guest of his brother-in-law, H. E. Schaefer. Mr. Muttart is one of the best known captains engaged in the straits navigation and has been in the ice boat service between Cape Fraverse and Cape Tormentine all his life. His father before him, the late Louis Muttart, was widely known as a most skillful and trustworthy navigator of the straits in the perilous winter season. Capt. Muttart has had some rough experiences in crossing the straits with ice boats and can tell many a thrilling tale of narrow escapes and daring deeds. He has seen all phases of crossing the straits in winter and summer and is one of the most experienced men in the business. Capt. Muttart lives at Cape Fraverse and has not been in Moncton before for thirty years. Needless to say he sees something of a change in this place. Winter before last the captain was on the Stanley and his experience then was something different from the work of running an ice boat.—Moncton Times.

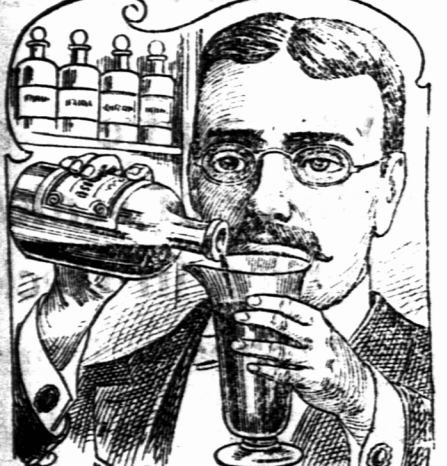

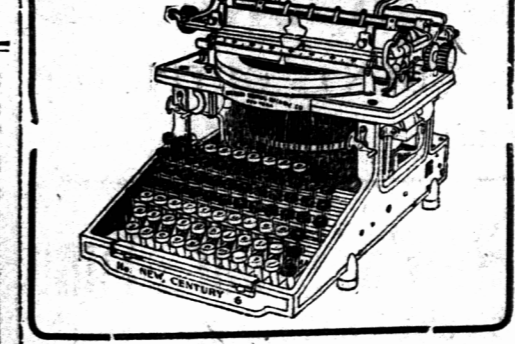

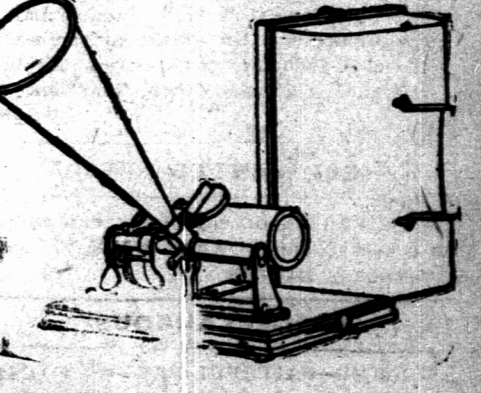
