

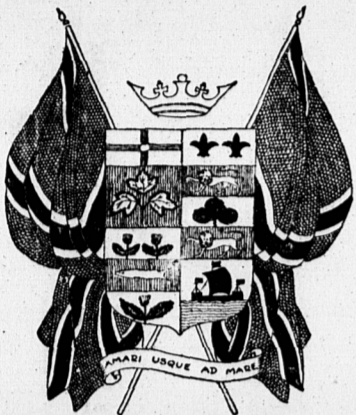

### IN MEMORIAM

MRS. JAMES HUGHES.

The death took place at her home in Freetown on Tuesday, June 26th of Mrs. James Hughes, aged 76 years. SENATOR BENNETT ADVISES PAY SIR H. THORNTON OFF.

OTTAWA, June 29—Bills for the control of grain rates on the great lakes received third reading in the Senate today.

Senator Casgrain claimed that the effect of the legislation on the ship-building industry would be to throw many men out of employment.

Senator Bennett said there was no sentiment among the ship owners and that they endangered the lives of the crews in inferior vessels. He also said that the national railways had tied up the government boats and carried coal for the national railways in American ships. Government railways, government elevators and government care, he said, were being discriminated against and if the present conditions were to prevail he would advise the government to pay off Sir Henry Thornton and let him go.

Senator Dandurand said the government was anxious to give the National Railways a fair chance.
