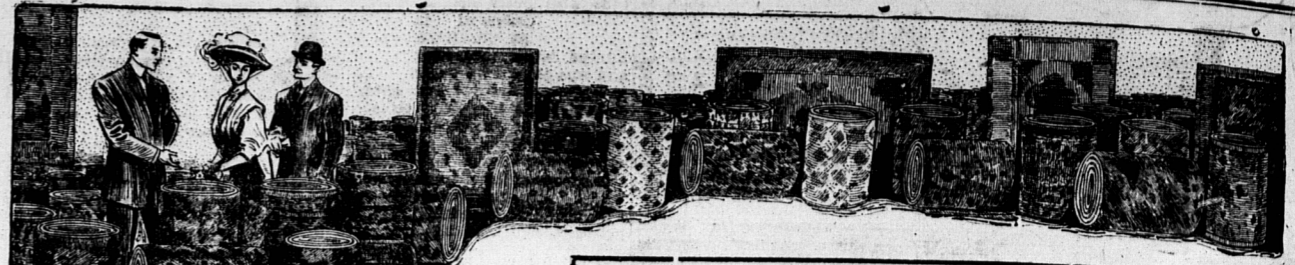
CHURCH GOERS TRY TO BLUFF GOD, SAYS

MONTREAL, Mar. 12—"The majority of churchgoers are trying to bluff God," said the Rev. Canon Almond of Trinity church, the preacher at the noon day Lenten service held in the hall above St. James street.

In the course of his twenty-minute sermon, which was principally an appeal for a more democratic type of Christianity, Canon Almond declared that he came to the conclusion that many people were trying to deceive God, because he found in the course of his mixing with all sorts of people, that became charitable, and went to church just because it was respectable.

"It does not say much for the church or for Montreal," said the Canon, "that with fifteen thousand men working between Victoria Square and the City Hall, there are streets in the district you could find more men than you find at this service to-day."

Canon Almond will have charge of the mid-day services for the remainder of the week.
