W. T. WHITE, FINANCE MINISTER OF CANADA.

Six months ago the political world had not heard of W. T. White. Today he is the Finance Minister of Canada. And he is but forty-four years of age, four years younger than Hon. W. S. Fielding was when he was called to the same position in the Laurier Cabinet fifteen years ago. And Mr. Fielding was then quite an experienced politician, having been for years Premier of Nova Scotia.

Mr White was, however, well known in the financial world, and had made good there before his entry into federal politics. He made his debut as a political speaker in Massey Hall, Toronto, when the business men of the Ontario metropolis met to take action against the reciprocity agreement. Unexpectedly to himself, apparently, as to others, he made the speech of the evening. He stated with great lucidity and force his objections as a business man, and illustrated his points with an occasional glint of humor. "If the United States offers us a gift horse, we should not only examine its mouth, but look out for its heels." Then he appeared at another meeting, with Mr. Borden and again he made a decided impression, and the last weeks of the campaign found him touring Ontario in the Conservative van.

Mr White is one of the famous eighteen prominent Liberals of Toronto who united with the Conservatives to defeat reciprocity. Their wealth, weight and influence made it seem reasonable that one of their number should be taken into the Cabinet. It was largely the dissenting Liberals in all the Provinces who turned the scale against the Laurier Government. Mr White had been a lifelong Liberal. Strong opposition has developed against him on that ground. Toronto is a Conservative stronghold and the ardent party men there think all the plums should have been passed into good Tory hands. So we have the Toronto Telegram, with which, by the way, Mr White once had an editorial connection, now calls upon the Conservatives to oppose his election.

It is too soon to predict how the new Finance Minister will succeed in office, but he is beyond question a man of alert mind, strong ability and good financial judgment. He is tall, slim and of fair complexion, looking even younger than he is. His sudden elevation to a most important post in governmental affairs is one of the surprises in Canadian politics and one of the notable results of the great upheaval of September last.

THE LAWLESSNESS OF ITALY.

When the war against Turkey was suddenly begun by Italy we expressed the opinion that it was an unprovoked attack, without warrant or justice or even a plausible excuse. This view is sustained by the English press and by the general sentiment of the world.

London Public Opinion says: "Italy has made war on Turkey in defiance of every law which gave fame to Rome—in defiance of every church and picture, and book in Italy. It has done a deed which scoffs at every thing for which Italy and Rome stand in the march of civilization and human culture."

English and German opinion is wholly against this war. The London Star says: "Italy has consummated her crime against humanity, against international law, against liberty, against justice, against right."

Moreover the people of Italy ar bitterly opposed to the war with Turkey. So fierce is the resistance that the Italian Government was forced to muzzle it by main force. In some cases women and children hung themselves on the rails in front of the military trains to prevent Italian soldiers going to the war. There were riots. The first blood shed in the war was Italian blood shed by

Italian soldiers.

The London Daily Graphic says: "The whole episode is so shameful and shocking that we can scarcely believe, even at this eleventh hour, that the conscience of Europe will not revolt against it. Nor is it merely a question of abstract morals. If this cynical raid is tolerated no state will henceforth be safe. The satisfaction of unlawful ambitions will only be a question of opportunity. It means a relapse into pure barbarism."

A DISAPPOINTING CENSUS.

The figures of the Canadian census are distinctly disappointing. The Statistical Department at Ottawa has always over-estimated the population between the census periods, and has done worse than usual in that regard during the ten years past. The department officials took careful account of the settlers coming in but failed to record the numbers going out of the country. Hence the people and even usually well-informed public men have been for a year or so past talking of Canada's great growth in population and fixing their estimate at eight millions or upwards, where the census figures now show but a mere fraction over seven millions.

Especially is the return of population in our own Province disappointing, as will appear from the subjoined table showing the numbers of the people in the years named:

Here it appears that the gain not only exceeds that of any previous decade, but that of three previous decades taken together. This is so far satisfactory, but it comes far short of realizing the expectations raised, or of accounting for the natural increase of our population with the immigration added. Immigration alone would account for all the gain made since 1901. Canada must have lost of these, or of her native population, or of both together, anywhere from half a million to three-quarters of a million people in the ten years past.

NOTES.
