Summerside is the next largest town in the Province, with about 4000 inhabitants. It is situated on beautiful Bedouque Bay and in the centre of a fine large farming region. It has the largest and finest departmental store in the Maritime Provinces, besides having other large retail stores. It has an Electric Light Plant, and a water works system and sewerage are being agitated for. Tourists are delighted with the beautiful scenery and the many pleasant drives in the immediate vicinity of Summerside. Georgetown and Souris are the two important towns in the eastern part of the Island, with a population of about 1,000 each.
