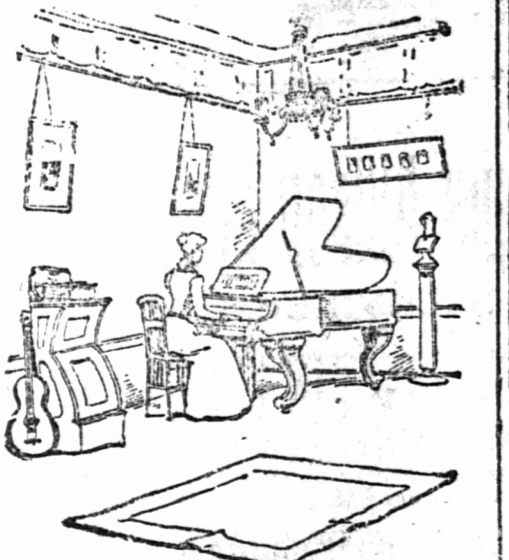

Here she married John Lanigan of that place. After dwelling there four years, they went to Cambridge Cross. The deceased leaves one sister Mrs. Nicholas Murphy of Sturgeon, and three brothers, William residing at Cambridge, and two at Tignish, one Mr. Edward Hackett M. P. and Augustine of the same place. She leaves five sons and two daughters William on the homestead, Michael, John and Daniel in Cambridge, and Capt James Lanigan of Souris, also Mrs. Bernard Kearney of Sturgeon and Mrs. Neil Campbell Gasperau. She also leaves eighty grand-children and nineteen great grand children. The funeral took place on the 13inst, when a large concourse of people followed the remains to St. Mary's Church, High Mass was celebrated by the Rev. Wm Phalen, and all that was mortal of the deceased was laid in its last resting place.

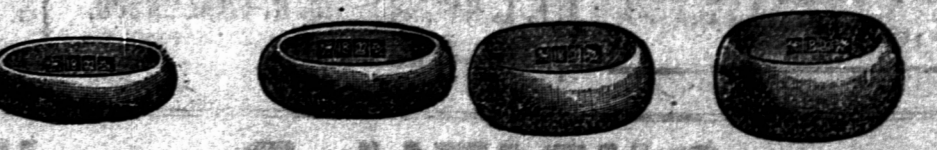
