FRIDAY an institute meeting was held in Tryon addressed by Prof. Dean and Cyrus Crosby. The meetings held at Kensington, Kingston, and Fredericton were very largely attended.

DR. Oronhyaekha, S. C. R., sailed on Wednesday, July 2, for home after an absence of a few weeks spent in Europe in the interests of the Independent Order of Foresters.—St. John Star.

A CORRESPONDENT in Cavendish writes that the Mount Hope Lobster factory leads, having the largest catch of lobsters per boat of any stage on the North shore. Its enterprising proprietor has a steam engine and intends enlarging his factory.

AT Saturday morning's session of the Supreme Court the Judges intimated to the counsel for Gillian that a decision would be given in the afternoon. Shortly after three o'clock however the Chief Justice took his seat upon the bench and intimated that they were unable to give a judgement until Monday morning.


