NEW YORK, April 14—Bullish sentiment, which has been simmering intermittently for some time, reached a boiling point Saturday as investors and traders bid stocks up for smart gains in the most active weekend session since last December.

Analysts singled out no one development to account for the rise. They held this improved attitude hinged on two factors: the spreading idea that eventual utility holding company legislation may not be so severe as previously feared; and the opinion held in many circles that misgivings over the railroad situation have been overcome.

Closing prices found the market at a point higher at 38.5 in terms of the Associated Press average of 60 stocks. The fact that activity broadened so much was seen by some as indication of the market's willingness to advance.
