EMPEROR FRANCIS JOSEPH OF AUSTRIA AT POINT OF DEATH

ROME, Jan. 3.—The Pope, who has always maintained the closest relations with the Austrian royal family, to-day was informed by messages from the court at Vienna that Emperor Francis Joseph's condition was most grave, and that his death probably would be a matter of hours.

Pope Pius sent his apostolic benediction to Vienna in anticipation of the death of the Emperor, in a message to Cardinal Nagl, papal nuncio at the Austria-Hungarian court, with instructions to withhold it until it became certain that the aged ruler of the dual monarchy was dying.
