### ONTARIO'S REFERENDUM.

Tomorrow the people of Ontario will vote for and against the tentative Prohibitory Act which the Legislature enacted at its last session. The law as it is now on the records of the Legislature is a close copy of the Manitoba Liquor Act. If the required majority vote in its favor the Act will go into effect on 1st May next. The required affirmative vote must, by the terms of the Referendum Act, not only give a clear majority of the votes now to be cast, but must amount throughout the Province to at least 212,723 votes. It is, we think, highly probable that the prohibitionist vote will be in the majority, but whether the required number will vote is much more doubtful.

Toronto Saturday Night, which is strongly opposed to prohibition, says "the liquor interests are now by no means so sure of saving their bacon as they were a short time ago." But a short time ago they were quite certain of an easy victory. Saturday Night blames the liquor men for not having conducted "an open and above-board campaign to offset the enthusiasm worked up all over the Province by the strenuous and loud-voiced methods of that small and fanatical section who flatter themselves that they can reform the world by legal enactment." It scolds the liquor men for having been "either too apathetic, or too mean-spirited, or too niggardly to devise or execute a plan that would enlist the services of men outside the trade and would strike the popular imagination." It may be, however, that the liquor men are wiser in their generation than the genial journal which is so desirous that they shall "save their bacon."

It is of interest on the eve of the great battle of the ballots in which more than one third of the population of the Dominion shall take part to-morrow, to get an estimate of the chances for a fair-minded opponent. Saturday Night admits that the prohibitionists have "made quite a stir." Its fears are for the rural vote, which may go strongly for prohibition, while it claims that the centers of population from the towns of three or four thousand up to the large cities of Ottawa, Hamilton and Toronto will assuredly vote no. But the journal we are quoting from sees danger even in the defeat of prohibition if it is only killed by a small majority and with a large vote in favor. This, it foresees "will inevitably lead to more stringent legislation against the bar-room." This candid admission shows the possibility of the temperance cause getting a fall on referendum day, and yet "falling its length ahead."

There are doubtless many intelligent readers of The Guardian who although entirely out of sympathy with the change would be interested in hearing a statement as the reasons which led a strongly intellectual man to change his spiritual allegiance from the Church of England to the Church of Rome. To such the opportunity will be afforded on Friday evening in the Opera House. Dr. Benjamin DeCosta of New York, who enjoys some eminence as a lecturer and a historian, will then and there give the reasons for his "conversion," and will no doubt present the matter from his standpoint in the strongest and most attractive light.

While the fishing interests of Gloucester Mass. are strongly opposed to the ratification of the reciprocity treaty with Newfoundland, Capt. Sol Jacobs is in the thick of the fray as an advocate of the treaty. Capt. Sol is, we believe a Newfoundland by birth, but now thoroughly republican in his views. He enjoys a wide notoriety in Canadian waters, not entirely confined to legitimate fishing.

Rev. Dr. Wild of Toronto is on record for taxing all churches and church property and devoting the proceeds toward providing homes for the poor. And by the way, there is one church in Toronto, a Baptist church we believe, which for years past has insisted upon paying taxes on the full assessable value of its property. This church prefers to pay some \$1,500 a year in taxes, rather than give its sanction to the principle of exemption.

The St. John Telephone Company is about to occupy its new building and has installed a new switchboard embodying several improvements. The subscriber does not need to ring to call Central. Merely taking the receiver off the hook does that. Placing the receiver on the hook again when the conversation is ended "rings off." The extensive system of wiring on the streets is nearly all cabled, several hundred wires in each cable. A part of the cables are supported in the air on poles, the remainder being placed underground.

The Montreal Witness, which frankly confesses to having done all it could to keep Mr. Prefontaine out of the Government, now finds some things to say in his favor, among which are the following: "Governments rule by party and parties recognize service rendered, and Mr. Prefontaine's service, not only to his party, but to his country, are undeniable. He stood by Mr. Joly when others fell away on account of that Premier's uncompromising rectitude, and won for him Chamby. In 1886 he carried the same County against Mr. Chapleau. During the South African war, he sprang to the front as a leader of loyalty at a time when such a leader was much needed. His friends say that whatever may be said of his municipal record, his parliamentary career is irreproachable."
