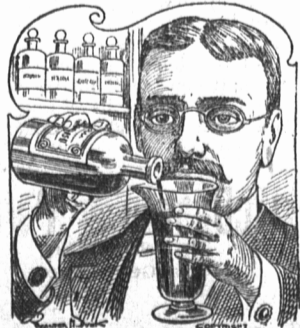

**ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST**

Reporters and Correspondents Everywhere.

THE death took place suddenly on Tuesday evening after a short illness from heart failure, of Nell McLean of Clyde River. The deceased had been about in fairly good health till about a week ago when he was taken ill. He was around however till a few minutes before the time of his death. There are left to mourn a sorrowing wife and one daughter to whom The Guardian extends its sincere sympathy.

THE "Ys" of Kensington held a social in their room on Tuesday evening, in the form of a farewell to Bruce Bernard, an honorary member, who intends leaving shortly for Halifax. A short program consisting of dialogues, readings and music was well rendered. A new member was initiated, and the President in a few words expressing the regret of the "Ys" at his departure presented Bruce with a "Y" pin. Cakes and coffee were served, and a pleasant evening was brought to an end by singing, "God be with you till we meet again."

A REGULAR meeting of the Police Relief and Aid Society was held Tuesday afternoon, at which the usual routine business was transacted. The association has received from Capt. Mellish, of P. E. Island, a contribution of five dollars to their funds. In a letter accompanying the donation Capt. Mellish said he wished to thank Chief of Police Clark and all his officers for the courteous treatment he received at their hands while in the city recently in connection with the McKinnon-McLaughlin Carriage Co. case.—St. John Sun

THE fourth annual meeting of the Canadian Association for the prevention of Consumption and other forms of tuberculosis was a very interesting gathering. The disease is said to cause one eighth of the deaths in this country, and from 30,000 to 40,000 persons are suffering from it. The field is not only large, but encouraging, for the disease is preventable and its earlier stages curable. Farmers will be specially interested in the question discussed by Dr. Ravenal of the Henry Phipps Institute, of Philadelphia. The doctor insists on the identity of human and bovine tuberculosis, and said that in the experience of many years he had not found any animals immune from tuberculosis. Though the chief cause of infection is inhalation, 25 per cent. of children's cases can be traced to food, especially milk and meat. His moral was the necessity of precaution against infection from animals. The chief message the convention sends out is "Live as much as possible in the open air." Overcrowding, bad ventilation, dark dirty rooms, bad or insufficient food, dissipation or anything that enfeebles the constitution and impairs its powers of resistance are to be avoided. This raises a broad question; for it means that the fight against consumption is part of the fight against poverty, ignorance and misery. As to treatment the convention recommends the fresh air sanitarium, where patients may have the best care without losing touch with their friends and family physicians. "Every patient who is cured in the sanitarium becomes an apostle of the gospel of fresh air." It is pointed out that the Nova Scotia government has just erected a sanitarium at Kentville, with capacity for 16 patients. There are in Canada only four other such institutions, and the total accommodation is only about sixteen beds. There is evidently much to be done.—Exchange.
