LONDON, March 21.—The emigration movement is in full swing now. The White Star liner Doric leaves to-day with 1,400 third-class passengers, half going under the £2 scheme.

There is a Canadian National party of 375 settlers of whom eighty are Welsh and 177 single men, the latter being under the British ministry of Labor scheme. The majority of all these are destined for Western Canada.
