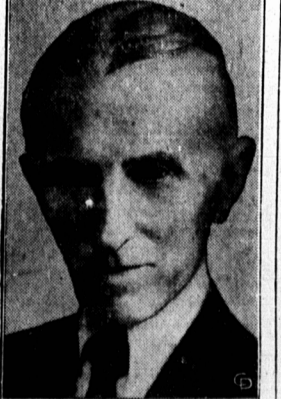

NEW YORK, July 26—Stocks poked their heads above the profit taking wave today.

Utilities, metals and scattered industrials took the lead. The firmest tone was in the final hour, but throughout the day the course of prices was steady.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was 4 of a point higher at 46.2. The utility issues used in the average rose 3 of a point to 33.2, a shade below their best for the year at 34.4.

Profit taking was in evidence in a few recent gainers with losses running to 1 or 2 points in such issues as Allied Chemical at 157, Hazel Atlas at 114, Amerasia at 96 and American Safety Razor at 94 1-2.

In the latter group were American Can at 14 1-4, Consolidated Gas at 27, Public Service of N. J. at 37 3-4 and Westinghouse at 61 5-8.

In the Canadian list Canadian Pacific, Dome and Hiram Walker were slightly higher.

Stores, International Nickel, Distillers-Seagrams and Ford of Canada showed small losses.
