A St. John's, Nfld., exchange says: S. S. Rosalind, Capt. Williams, from Charlottetown, via Sydney, reached port early yesterday morning, bringing a full cargo, consisting of hay, cats, poultry, etc., but no passengers. She reports passing an iceberg of fairly good size, about twelve miles east of Cape Race, near Petty Harbour. A "growler" was also seen.

The almost summerlike weather prevailing here around Christmas was general in the Maritime Provinces. A St. John's exchange recently said—"The present weather continues much longer. St. John will soon attain celebrity as a winter resort. Solomon McConnell, of the North End, this morning picked a daisy in full bloom in his garden. L. B. Crook, on Christmas Eve, picked two large pansy blossoms in the garden of his father-in-law, Henry McFarlane, St. David street.

The steamer Aberdeen arrived Monday from St. John's. The steamer left here Tuesday afternoon, but on account of the rough weather prevailing at the island, was only able to effect a landing on Saturday morning. She took four Marconi operators to the island, and brought four off, also two boatmen and Mrs. Edwards, wife of the keeper of the west-end light. The Aberdeen encountered terrific weather on the way to Halifax, the wind blowing a regular hurricane.—Halifax Exc. (The Aberdeen is a frequent visitor to this port.)

The annual public examination of Alexandra School took place Friday 22nd, a large number of parents and friends being present. The school was tastefully decorated for the occasion. The pupils were examined in the various subjects by their teacher, Charles S. McDonald and raters, and showed by their prompt and correct answers that they had been carefully taught. After the examining of the pupils a program of recitations, songs, etc., was rendered. The pupils presented the teacher with a Christmas gift and, in return, were heartily thanked and treated to candy, cake, etc. The examination was brought to a close by speeches and words of approval in favor of the work carried on in the school.

Members of the Presbyterian congregations throughout the Province will be interested in the following despatch from Toronto: One million dollars is the sum total of the budget of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church of Canada to be spent on missions during the year 1912. This is considered no great sum when the burden laid on that denomination comprises 14,000,000 heathen. The Assembly's Committee on Estimates after careful consideration has adopted what proportions should go to each of the various enterprises. About one-third of the whole amount or \$325,000 will go to home missions while almost equal amount \$310,000 has been appropriated for foreign missions.

The Presbytery of P. E. I. in connection with the Church of Scotland meets in regular session in the Peoples Church Charlottetown, on Tuesday January 2nd 1912, at 11 a. m.

The London Daily Mail says:—"It has been decided that Prince Adolph, third son of the German Emperor, shall go abroad on the protected cruiser Bremen, of the German Atlantic station in July. He will probably pay a visit to New York, Boston and other American cities. (The Bremen was here last summer.)

At the recent Championship Indoor Athletic meet in New York, Will Halpeny, of this city, under the Montreal A. A. A. colors, won third in the pole vault for distance, his mark being 27feet, 3 inches.
