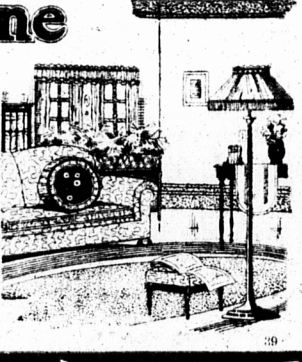

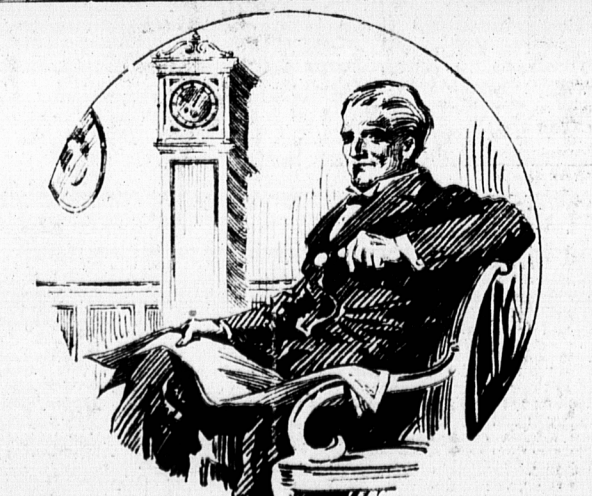

### Sunday School Lesson

ISAIAH'S SUMMONS AND RESPONSE

The Golden Text—"Here am I; send me."—Isa. 6: 8

The Lesson Text—Isa. 6: 1-8  
For entire lesson see Isa. ch. 6  
The Time—735 B. C.  
The Place—Jerusalem or Judas.

Lesson Text Illumined

1. In the year that king Uzziah died, "Tha" is about 735 B. C. Tradition adds the exact day, namely the Day of Atouement. The chapter relates the story of the prophet's inaugural call and commission. The event marked an epoch in his life, and was ever remembered by him even as we remember, in some cases, the exact time of our conversion, or of our ordination to the gospel ministry. If, on the other hand, the chapter describes only a call on the prophet's part to a deeper spiritual life, as some think, as does Ezek. 33: 21-25, it is still of peculiar value. It is far better, however, to treat the whole account as the story of the prophet's original call to preach. Standing, as it does in ch. 6 instead of at the beginning of the book, it shows how when his prophet's authority to pronounce "woes," as in ch. 5: 8-23 was challenged, he retorted by saying that in the year that Uzziah died he pronounced a "woe" upon himself, ch. 6: 1-5. The whole story, accordingly from this point of view becomes an apology. Ordinary ministers and Bible teachers ought still to have a similar experience on which to fall back for defense. Isaiah had seen the Lord; he realized his own unworthiness, he had been accepted and commissioned to preach; therefore he could rebuke with authority! This is one of the great lessons of the story. I saw the Lord. In what sense did Isaiah see the divine and almighty and majestic Sovereign? "No man hath seen God at any time." In Isa. 1: 2, the same graphic idea is presented "when ye come to see my face." (Marginal Tradition says that Isaiah was "sawn asunder" because he claimed to have seen God. Upon a throne, as had Micah, Isaiah saw Jehovah in kindly state, Cf. 1 Kings 22: 19. His train. That is, his robe God being conceived of anthropomorphically. "No face, on east and west, with a horn that I could recognize." (Browning). The temple, by being accustomed to going to church, Isaiah saw a vision.

2. Seraphim. The name indicates "fiery creatures". Here they are winged, angelic beings of human form, resembling cherubim. Cf. Ezek. 1: 5, 13, 14. With train. The three pairs of wings are sometimes interpreted as symbolizing reverence, humility, and service, but there is nothing to warrant this symbolism.

3. Holy, holy, holy. Isaiah saw a vision of the holiness of Jehovah, as Ezekiel did of his glory, Ezek. chs. 1 to 3. Holiness and glory are closely related. Holiness has been defined as hidden glory and glory as disclosed holiness. To Isaiah, Jehovah was three holy, that is, he was unique and separate from all the gods. The word "holiness" etymologically means "separation." Because of this vision of Jehovah's holiness, Isaiah became, what we are wont to call him, "the prophet of holiness"; his favorite name for Jehovah being "the Holy One of Israel."

4. The house was filled with smoke. Emblematic of the effect when holiness and sin meet. Smoke is in Scripture indicative of the divine wrath. Ps. 74: 1 Deut. 29: 26.

5. Then said I. Who to me? I had pronounced a series of woes upon his people, Isa. 5: 8, 9, and felt warranted in doing so, because he had pronounced "woe" unto himself. A man of unclean lips. Through profanity and unclean speech, Peter "began to curse and to swear." Mark 14: 71. A people of unclean lips. Like the Moslems, of whom the missionary says, "Their thoughts are often too foul and their minds too sensual really to understand a pure spiritual religion like that of the gospel."

6. A live coal. Referring to the Oriental method of using hot stones and coals in cooking, but intended in this case to burn away the prophet's guilt. First like water and blood, is a great purifier.

7. Thy sin forgiven. The Old Testament introduces us to the great doctrine of forgiveness—a forgiveness due wholly to God's grace. Jesus deepened and broadened it, adding an original stamp, for he taught unlimited forgiveness, "seventy times seven."

8. I heard the voice of the Lord. Only a forgiven sinner can hear such a voice. Who will go for us? The parat "us" accommodates itself to the Christian doctrine of the Trinity, built primarily on the celestial attendants or "council" includes the ones "alluded to in v. 3. Cf. Ps. 89: 7. Here, am I, despatch me. This is the climax of the story. Isaiah responded. His commission followed. It was a hard commission yet he accepted it with alacrity.—By Prof. Geo. L. Robinson, Ph. D., D.
