HAS TUBERCULOSIS SERUM.

NEW YORK, Feb. 6.—Hurry home from abroad with tuberculosis serum in his possession that he says is the first of the widely discussed Friedman culture to be brought to this country. Dr. Martin B. Held, a physician of Pittsburg, arrived on the steamer Potsdam from Europe today and at once took a train for his home, where his wife, a consumptive, awaits the arrival of what Dr. Held believes will be a cure for her. Dr. Held has enough bacilli for only one patient, he declared. That patient will be his wife. Dr. Held was met at quarantine by Dr. Milton H. Foster, of the Ellis Island health service and questioned in behalf of the United States government about the Friedman cure. Dr. Held told Dr. Foster he had been convinced of the efficiency of the cure and had obtained from Dr. Friedman just enough serum to treat a patient suffering from tuberculosis of the bone. LUMBER OPERATIONS ON THE ST. CROIX

CALAIS, Feb. 4.—If the present weather conditions continue, many lumber operators on the waters of the St. Croix will be ruined, as without snow enough it will be impossible for them to fulfil their contracts with the large operators. Many of the former are men of limited capital, and unless snow comes soon to aid them they will stand to lose heavily. In several instances the operators have crews and teams at points in the woods that can be reached only when the streams and swamps are frozen, and they can neither use the men and equipment to good advantage or get them out where the expense of caring for them will be less. The men and horses are literally eating their heads off while waiting for snow, and the prospect is a gloomy one for the employe and owner. Such conditions as prevail this winter are unheard of, and the oldest operator cannot remember a time when there was not sufficient snow at this season of the year to move the early winter cut of timber. The ice men who operate on the river and streams in this vicinity are also discouraged by the present mild weather and what little ice has been cut is decidedly thin. The total crop harvested up to this time is away below the average, and ice will be a somewhat expensive luxury along the border during the coming summer if freezing weather is delayed much longer. Most of the ice cut up to this time is less than seven inches in thickness, while in ordinary winters the average thickness would be nearer 18 inches.

NAVAL DEBATE DRAGS ALONG

OTTAWA, Feb. 5.—The House resumed the naval debate to-day. Liberals doing all the talking, while a bare quorum maintained a perfunctory attendance. The speakers to-day were Turgeon, Gloucester; Thompson, Qu'Appelle, and Marcell, Bonaventure. Mr. Turgeon argued exhaustively there was no emergency. Hon. Mr. Marcell contended that the proposed gift of dreadnoughts was unconstitutional. He drew the adjournment.

The standing committee on marine and fisheries will on Thursday take up Hon. J. D. Hazen's bill respecting radio-telegraphy. The measure requires all boats plying 200 miles or more and carrying fifty people, to be equipped with wireless. Amendments have been suggested reducing the limit of distance and increasing the passenger limit, while some members favor an act requiring a wireless equipment for all passenger vessels.
