THE SALE OF POISONS.

The recommendation of the coroner's jury at the Morrison inquest should receive the immediate attention of the Government and Legislature: "The jury strongly recommend that the Legislature shall pass a pharmacy law to restrict the indiscriminate sale of drugs and chemicals of a poisonous nature." The like recommendation was made by a previous coroner's jury in this city. The sale is properly described as indiscriminate. There is apparently no check except the discretion of the druggist, and druggists, like other merchants naturally desire to sell their goods. Our leading druggists are no doubt careful, but young clerks at their counters may sometimes sell poisons to persons without that strict inquiry which ought always to be made as to the object of the purchaser and in other cases where the sale is to say the least imprudent. We put it very mildly in saying this.

Let any reader of the daily papers recall how many fatal cases of poisoning have occurred within the past few years. It is an appalling record. To give the names of the victims would be needlessly recall most painful memories. Next in number to the direct victims of the unlawful liquor trade would be found the awful number of suicides which often are closely connected therewith. All other causes do not lead half as many to suicide as follow in the wake of drunkenness and debauch. And some way the drinking of liquor to excess seems to suggest poison as the means of ending a life already shipwrecked. Hitherto any, or at least most of those who wanted poison have been able to buy it without difficulty. The duty of the Legislature

is clearly to provide additional safeguards against this indiscriminate sale of the means of death. Many suicides who have in a moment of despondency terminated their lives would have been living today had they not been able to obtain the fatal potion with such easy readiness.

It will be an ill day for Charlottetown should party politics be introduced into our civic elections, as The Examiner seems disposed to do in the contest in Ward Two. No candidate should be selected because he is either a Liberal or a Conservative or merely because he is a little younger or a little older than another. Character, ability and fitness for the position are the prime requisites. Beyond this The Guardian is not disposed to advise the electors. Many of them know the two candidates probably better than we do and if they make their choice wholly on the ground of fitness and without respect of party we shall be content with the result.
