BATTLE AND DISEASE.

It is no uncommon thing in a military campaign for the deaths from disease to exceed the number of those killed in battle and those who die from wounds. In the war in South Africa the fatalities from disease in the earlier and bloodier parts of the campaign were comparatively small. More recently the deaths from disease have sadly increased, while the weekly tale of those slain directly by the fighting have been much less than before. To make this clear the following figures may be cited:

The war began on October 12, 1899. The list of casualties issued by the British War Office five months later showed that there had been a total of 3,447 deaths; of these 2,418 were killed in battle or died of wounds, while 1,029 died of disease. In other words the fatalities arising directly from wounds were nearly two and a half times as great as the fatalities from disease.

Since the date of that report and down to the 19th May the total number of the dead since the beginning of the war had increased to 5,633, of whom 2,803 were killed in battle or died of wounds, while 2,830 met their end from diseases. In other words in the period between March 12 and May 19 the fatalities from arms were but 412 and from disease 1,774, or more than four times the greater proportion of deaths from disease.

It is no longer the enemy's bullets and shells that constitute the greatest danger to our boys in South Africa, but rather the enteric fever and dysentery. And unfortunately this danger remains even after the military power of the Boers has been broken. Lord Roberts has conducted his great and decisive operations with a marvellous economy of life so far as deaths in battle or from wounds are concerned, but he cannot modify an unhealthy climate. For this reason we should all most ardently desire that the war may be ended as speedily as possible.

The financial statement of the Red Cross Society which appears in another column is most creditable to the ladies of that body, who in a most unostentatious manner have raised nearly \$1,200 for a most worthy purpose.

We are glad to notice that Premier Farquharson has given notice of a resolution declaring in favor of the policy of Provincial Prohibition, to be followed by a Bill along the same lines. The proposed measure is not intended to take effect until 1st June next year.

There appears to be some misapprehension in regard to the City Bill now before the Legislature by which the system of ward elections as at present existing will be changed. The Bill cannot go into effect until a majority of the city electors pronounce in its favor at a plebiscite to be held on the second Wednesday in February 1901. If the Bill is not satisfactory it can then be disposed of by a majority vote against it.

PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND

And its Attractions to Tourists.

Prince Edward Island's summer climate is delightful, and the scenery is beautiful and quietly picturesque. Surrounded by the Gulf of St. Lawrence, it enjoys all the coolness of the sea breeze, and the advantages that can only be derived from sea bathing, at about 65 degrees.

Charlottetown has over 12,000 inhabitants, and is the capital. It has many great retail stores, besides a large wholesale trade. It has a Gas Light and Power Company, two Electric light plants, and a street railway is in embryo. It has a first class water works and sewerage system. It is famed for its wide and shaded streets, its many pleasant drives, the principal of which is the new Park Boulevard, its attractive surroundings, pure water, and clear, cool and bracing air. It is widely known as one of the healthiest cities in Canada. It has two hospitals, many churches and a large and elegant new Opera house. It also has several fine public buildings and a market which is one of the chief sources of the citizens' pride. It has one of the largest and best equipped pork-packing establishments in the Dominion. On its west side is Victoria Park—a favorite summer resort—while on the east are the magnificent new Exhibition Buildings and Driving Park. Chief among its public squares is Queen Square in the centre of the city, beautifully laid out with blooming plants of every description, fountains, and well arranged walks, and enlivened with a band of music during the summer evenings. The rural scenery in the vicinity of Charlottetown is charming, and horses for driving are abundant at very low prices. Boats can also be hired, and steamers run regularly on the bays and rivers, affording most pleasant excursions. The principal hotels are Davies, Queen, and Revere.

Summerside has about 4000 inhabitants. It is situated on beautiful Bedeque Bay. It has the largest and finest departmental store in the Maritime Provinces, besides having other large retail stores. It has an Electric Light Plant, and a water works system and sewerage are being agitated for. The hotels are—Clifton, Russ and Campbell. Georgetown and Souris have a population of about 1,000 each. In the former are the Aitken, and Tapper hotels and in Souris the Sea View. At Cape Traverse, a very pleasant summer resort, is the Landsdowne hotel; in Alberton, the Albion Terrace and Wisner; in Tignish the Railway; in Kensington, Clark's and Commercial; in Montague, McDonald; and in Mount Stewart, Clark's and Manson.

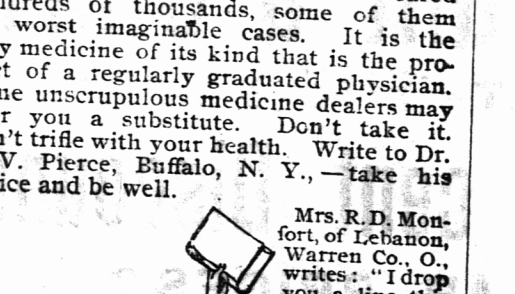
The following hotels open for the summer season: At Hampton, Pleasant View; at Stanhope, Match and Cliff; at Brackley Point, Shaw's; at Ruston, Seaside; at Malpeque, North Shore; at Tracadie Beach, Acadia; at Alberton, Seaford; and at Pownal, Florida.

In addition to those already mentioned there are other towns and villages in the Province with hotel accommodation, while many farm houses prepare for the reception of tourists. The rivers and streams teem with trout, the bays with mackerel, while game of every description abounds.
