CITIZENS will have the opportunity tonight of seeing the interior of the new Presbyterian church, Summerside, and hear the new pipe organ for the first time. There will be an interesting and pleasant program and the organ will be played by a master.

A PECULIAR incident occurred at Alberton, which was more or less remotely connected with the Prohibition cases tried there on Thursday. It appears that Mary Welsh one of the defendants, suddenly remembered on the eve of the trial that she had been grievously assaulted in August last, by a man who was appointed as a prominent witness. Accordingly she procured a warrant and Officer Brennan, Summerside, was detailed to execute same forthwith. Accompanied by a posse committatus, the officer arrived at Alberton on Wednesday night and surrounded the defendant witness. After lying in wait all night, the officer attempted to arrest his man, when he found that Mr. Gough had preceded him with a warrant holding the alleged offender as a witness. Officer Brennan was obliged to occupy a back seat till the trials were over, after which the unfortunate witness-prisoner was conveyed to Tignish, where before two of the magistrates, justices of the peace, justice was summarily dispensed, and the prisoner now a witness no longer, was committed to jail in Summerside, there to await final adjustments by the Supreme Court.

THE organ recital given in the Presbyterian church, Summerside, last evening, was in every way a success. There was a large attendance and it is quite within the mark to say that all were delighted, aside from the attractive appearance of the church, as elsewhere stated, has recently been repaired. The new pipe organ was the great attraction. Professor Stuart is master of his art, and under his manipulation the organ was given a voice that spoke to and thrilled the audience. It would be impossible even to give a faint idea of the wonderful power of the instrument and its almost infinite range. Suffice it to say the audience was thoroughly delighted and that all went away feeling that they had enjoyed one of the rarest treats of a lifetime. 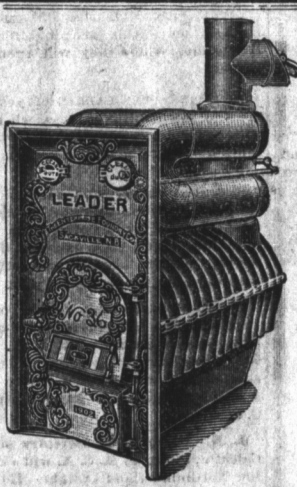
