East Point Institute met at Priest Pond on the 3rd inst., and discussed cooperation to improve the stock, farmers, methods of operation also in buying and selling, marketing pork, so as to prevent the usual glut, and consequent drop in price such as occurred last fall, also the need of better methods of marketing eggs by which strictly fresh guaranteed eggs could be shipped more directly to the consumers. It was shown that there was a loss of 17 per cent in shrinkage alone on eggs, also that from three to six middle men come between the producer and consumers.

REPLY TO "TRUTH SEEKER."

Sir,—As a student of Prince of Wales College may I venture to reply to "Truth Seeker's" letter which appears in your issue of Wednesday? In the first place I am quite convinced that "Truth Seeker" has never attended P. W. C., or he would never grumble at a lack of attention given in that institution, to "what the cultural class stand in need of."

Again "Truth Seeker" speaks of "first, last and all the time" implying on us a lack of instruction leading to prepare us for high standing in some of the large universities; and again I feel sure he writes without knowing the facts of the case. For example in my first year in P. W. C. I taught for five weeks in the Model School of the college, becoming familiar with the practical part of school teaching. Again in that same year I attended a course of lectures under the head of "School Management" which supplied the theoretical side of the subject, and a class in a physical culture in which each pupil was trained to teach in charge of a school. In my second year even more attention was paid to developing the "teacher's" side of my being. I was taught ease and self-confidence when addressing a room of people at a regularly organized debating society where each pupil was called upon to speak at set intervals. I attended a regular course of lectures known as Education. These dealt fully with child life and child training as approved of by the most successful educationalists of the age such as Prof. James. There was too the physical culture course in which we learned, as well as developing our own bodies, games and exercises suitable to the school room. Surely such instruction as this would not be given in a course calculated only to prepare us for high standing in some university? I might add he need not worry about the "dominant influence of one or more back numbers on the staff"—we have no "back numbers" in P. W. C.

His total of 46 subjects is also very misleading. He adds together the subjects assigned to the three different years and thus makes a subject such as Latin—which is studied in the whole three years—to appear as 3 different subjects when it is in reality only one continued. As to his dissertation on Greek. Greek is not taught in our public schools nor in first year in P. W. C. In the other two years it is purely optional, another subject may be studied in its place. So the conclusion that Greek is as necessary to the teacher as arithmetic is groundless—(along his line of argument.)
