The Northumberland's cargo Saturday included fifteen hundred boxes of cheese. Friday she took over one thousand cases lobsters, five hundred boxes cheese, eleven cattle and four horses.

The news was received last night of the death of Captain Joseph McDonald, a well known Master-mariner of that place. The funeral is to take place tomorrow morning.

The SS Perry from Boston is due here early tomorrow morning and will sail on return at noon; and the Halifax will arrive on Thursday evening and sail on return at noon Friday. After that the trips will be resumed as usual.

John F. Whear, arrived home on Saturday night from St. Stephen, N. B., where he had been as delegate to the Maritime Grand Lodge I. O. O. F. Mr. Whear had the honor of being elected as a grand representative to the Supreme Grand Lodge.

So far as is known at present the Governor General will visit at 1030 to-morrow morning the McDonald Consolidated school at Hillsboro. Returning to the City in the afternoon their excellencies will probably enjoy a drive about Charlottetown and suburbs, most likely visiting the golf links, where they will possibly be entertained. On Wednesday the Governor General will attend the Scottish Gathering at Georgetown and on Wednesday evening the visit will probably terminate. There will be a dinner party at Government House tomorrow evening. It has not yet been possible definitely to arrange the events and it will not be known exactly what will be done until the arrival of the party this evening.

**SIR HARRY McLEAN STILL PRISONER**  
 TANGIER, Aug. 15.—It has been learned that Sir Harry MacLean, the Englishman in the service of the Sultan of Morocco, who has been a prisoner of the Bandit Raisuli since early in July, has not been set at liberty as reported. The British Legation here today received a communication from Raisuli threatening that unless his terms are accepted immediately, he would remove MacLean to a place where all the armies of Europe, if united could not follow. It seems that Raisuli, upon hearing of the bombardment and occupation of Oussabianca, succeeded in taking MacLean back from the Kass tribesmen and removed him to a strategic position in the neighborhood of Ben Arous.
