THE NEW PREMIER. Yesterday afternoon the liberal members supporting the local Government met in the Legislative Council chamber for the purpose of receiving the formal resignation of Premier Warburton and also for the purpose of nominating a man whom the retiring leader might recommend to His Honor the Lieutenant Governor to form a new administration. Mr. Farquharson was the unanimous choice of the party and when Mr. Warburton retires Monday next the former's name will be handed in to the Lieutenant Governor. We are not in a position to state the personnel of the new administration but it is probable that few changes will be made beyond asking Mr. Sinclair to become one of the Executive. All the others will likely be re-appointed. It is also probable that Mr. McDonald will be re-appointed Attorney-General and that Mr. MacMillan and Mr. McLean will retain their respective portfolios for the present.

So far as we can learn the proceedings at the meeting were of the most harmonious and satisfactory character. At first, it is said, that other names besides Mr. Farquharson's were suggested for the leadership. All others suggested, however, retired in Mr. Farquharson's favor. We congratulate Mr. Farquharson on his elevation and we believe that the fact of his appointment will give general satisfaction to the country. Mr. Farquharson's appointment will be specially gratifying to the temperance element in the community and that element fortunately forms the large majority of the electors of the Province. Mr. Farquharson is also a staunch economist and in these days when our finances are somewhat straitened the public will have the utmost confidence that in no department of the service will a dollar of public money be allowed to be wasted. The new premier has a difficult task before him—to straighten out and place on a satisfactory footing the finances of this province. If he succeeds, as we have confidence that he will, he will be entitled to the gratitude of all who have the future well being of the province at heart.

EDITORIAL NOTES. The Boston Herald observes that the new governor-general of Canada, Earl Minto, is a man who has won popularity in every capacity he has filled. His only weakness is said to be a quick temper that he cannot always control. Ah! a trifle peppermint now and then.

No intimation has been made that the bands have yet replied to the question asked by the City Council. Until this matter is explained in some way the majority of citizens will be inclined to censure the bands even though they may not merit it. If any explanation can be given why it is not forthcoming.

Some American papers are of the opinion that no further punishment will be imposed upon the war correspondent, Scovel, than that of sending him away from Cuba. This is rather mild punishment for slapping a general's face. It may be, however, that he did not slap Gen. Shatter's face. The general himself, in his account of the affair, speaks only of Scovel's striking at him, which was bad enough, but not so bad an offence as that at first represented.

In another column is chronicled the success of Mr. Ewen MacMillan, of New Haven, a young man who has taken a course at the Ontario Agricultural College with a view of better fitting himself for the farming profession. The course pursued by this young man cannot be too highly commended and should be followed by hundreds of boys throughout the province. The time has arrived when a farmer must understand his business. Our most successful men now agree that a special training is required for this profession equally as much as for any other. The trend of the time was once to ignore this noble calling and to follow what is wrongly called the higher professions of life. But happily another era is dawning upon us and the successful agriculturist or horticulturist is now looked upon as a man of intellect, one capable of taking his stand on all leading questions of the day, a man of power in the community. Let more of the young men remain tillers of the soil, skilled in this then special pursuit. The cities are overcrowded. The other professions are over crowded but in agriculture is a field almost limitless in its resources. Socrates, the wisest philosopher of antiquity, said:—"Agriculture is an employment the most worthy of the application of man; the most ancient and the most suitable to his nature. It is the common nurse of all persons in every age and condition of life; it is the source of health, strength, plenty and riches and of a thousand sober delights and honest pleasures. It is the mistress and school of sobriety, temperance, justice, religion, and, in short, of all virtues, civil and military." "And from a moral point of view," Lord Russell remarks, "the life of the agriculturist is the most pure and holy of any class of men."
