### COLORED AMERICANS APPEAL FOR RIGHTS

PARIS, June 16.—William Trotter, of Boston, Mass., secretary of the National Equal Rights League, has presented to every member of the Peace Conference a petition from colored citizens of American asking that a clause assuring all citizens "full liberty in the rights of democracy and protection of life without distinction based on race, color or previous condition," be inserted in the covenant of the League of Nations.

### SCHOOL MEETINGS

#### STANLEY BRIDGE.

Voted at their annual meeting the sum of \$200 presumably for one teacher as the number of children in the district has decreased considerably.

This is an increase of \$100 over the sum voted for principal last year and \$25 more than for principal and assistant.

#### MOUNT STEWART.

The annual meeting of the Mount Stewart School District was held in the school house at 4 o'clock on Tuesday, Mr. A. J. Grant occupying the chair; Mr. R. C. Clark acting secretary. The retiring trustees, Mr. John McAskill was succeeded by Mr. R. C. Clark. \$150 supplement was voted for the principal, and \$125 for the assistant, an increase of \$75 and \$50 respectively. \$150 was voted for the contingent expenses.

#### MURRAY RIVER.

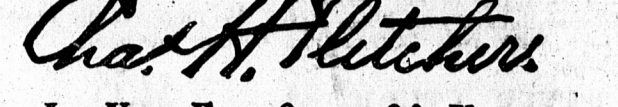
