## HE WOULD CHANGE INHERITANCE LAW

### PHYSICIAN BELIEVES SECOND OR THIRD SON, NOT FIRST, SHOULD TAKE THE TITLE

LONDON, May 11—"The law of inheritance should be altered so that not the eldest but the second or the third son comes into the possession of title, property and position on the father's death."

This revolutionary opinion was given by a physician with a large family practice when discussing the examinations of only and eldest children recently made in Vienna by Professor J. Friedjung, from which it would appear that only and eldest children are usually, timid, neurotic, unstable and hysterical.

The professor had under examination one hundred such children, forty-five of them being boys, of whom all only thirteen were fully normal. Eighteen were severely neurotic and sixty-nine showed nervous

instability. "I have frequently noticed that the eldest children are often backward and neurotic," said the family physician referred to. "The eldest child has usually been the only child for a considerable period and the only child is the hub of the house. Everybody has to give way to it, everything is sacrificed to it, and the child speedily suffers from exaggerated ego. Such a child is spoiled, pampered and improperly fed. Even supposing it is not true that the first child is naturally not so good as later children, he soon becomes not so good because of the way he is treated."

"In large families the healthy children, physically and mentally, are those who, having been born latest, are left to grow up by themselves and look after each other, instead of being coddled and sheltered by the parents. Children of a big family are far fitter than those in a family of one or two children only."

"Professor Friedjung is quite right," said another physician. "Professor Nari Pearson, indeed, has said that first children, because they are first, are decidedly below the others both physically and in intelligence. They are children of the early part of the marriage, and the best children are born when the mother is aged from twenty-eight to thirty-five. Apart from that theory, there is the fact that they seldom play with the children of the same age as themselves, but are constantly with the grownups, and the grownup mind is quite different from the mind of a child, so that these children develop an abnormal psychology."

"The ordinary child has vivid imagination, the grownup has not, but has reduced all experience to logical formulae, so that the mind of the child who has to associate with grownups becomes warped and does not develop naturally. The eldest child while it is the only child is given so much care and attention that it is pampered. All its minor wants are looked after far to well, and it does not learn independence of action or thought."

## JEALOUS MAN SHOOTS WIFE KILLS HIMSELF

BOSTON, May 10—In a jealous rage Geo. Matthews, of 11 Hallam street, Dorchester shot and probably fatally wounded his wife last night in the kitchen of their apartment, then shot himself. The bullet pierced his brain and he died immediately.

The tragedy occurred at 11:30 o'clock. Matthews had been away all the evening. Upon returning home he found his wife in the kitchen. He had been drinking heavily. A quarrel which had started Sunday was renewed, and after the pair had engaged in a heated discussion Matthews drew a 38-calibre revolver which he was in the habit of carrying and fired.

His first shot crashed through the kitchen window. Mrs. Matthews endeavored to escape, but as she neared the door her husband fired again. The bullet passed through her body. Then he placed the revolver to his right temple and fired. He sank to the floor dead.

Mrs. Matthews staggered upstairs to the apartment of Mr. and Mrs. S. Upton, where she related calmly what had happened.

Attracted by the sound of the shooting, Edward S. Pine, who lives at 9 Hallam street, rushed in. At the request of Mrs. Matthews he took down in writing her will. On the next day she directed how all her possessions be disposed of.

Dr. Frederick M. Sears, who was attending a patient next door, ran to the house. From station 11 went an ambulance and three officers. The woman was removed to the City Hospital.

The bullet passed through her right side, penetrating the liver, stomach and lungs and passing an inch and a half below the heart.
