Mrs. W. W. Clarke said farewell to her friends here this week and left on Friday morning on a visit to Providence, R.I.

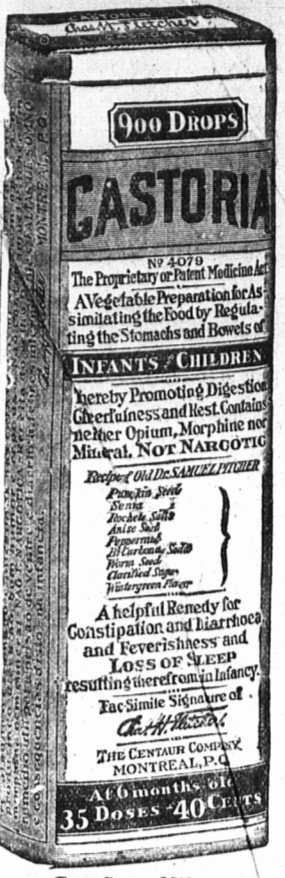
The ladies of Zion Church had an afternoon tea at the Russ Hotel on Thursday afternoon which was most successful financially as well as socially.
