The Water Commissioners have secured another term without opposition, and we believe our citizens are well content to have it so. These gentlemen have rendered good service and no change was called for. Councillors Reddin and Riley have been equally fortunate. Some opposition had been talked of in both Wards but it did not materialize. They are to be congratulated on their easy election and in the two years to come will have the advantages of experience already gained.

The latest murder in Windsor, Nova Scotia, adds one more to the long black list of whiskey tragedies. The despatches tell of a dozen flasks and ale bottles lying around the room in which the tragedy occurred, evidences of the drinking orgy in which the murderer and his victim had taken part. How many thousands of such tragedies the whiskey trade has brought about, and yet there are persons, who would legalize the traffic and seek to make it respectable. Worse still, they can occasionally quote a misguided preacher in its support.

From information received there is reason to fear that the use of liquors and corrupt treating are contemplated by certain parties in the coming civic election. We learn also that more than the usual vigilance will be exercised to prevent, as far as practicable any violation of the law. Of course, those who will take the risk must be prepared to face the penalty of \$100 fine. It would be better all round to have the election conducted in the orderly and sober manner which befits the important work of election day, and we trust that this may be done.

The New Brunswick Legislature is now in session, and before the present month has expired all the Provincial Legislatures except our own will either be in session or have concluded their labors for this year. Just why the Island Legislature should be the last to meet is not quite apparent, except possibly that its sittings are usually shorter than those of other legislative bodies. It would be well, we think if that august body could be called together and do its work before the pressure of the spring trade and business becomes pressing.

The Portland, Me. Press tells that the United States Commissioner General of Immigration has been recently in conference with the Grand Trunk officials, and the result will be the building of quarters for immigrants at one of the Grand Trunk wharves in Portland. The Press says "It is anticipated that when the Grand Trunk Pacific is finished thousands of immigrants will land here, where hundreds do now, and that better accommodation will be needed." The Press evidently has great hopes for Portland from our coming all—Canadian Transcontinental line, but we must still hope for the best.
