The following is important to shippers. Steamers of the Manchester line will make three sailings from Charlottetown to Manchester direct this season, calling here as follows: Manchester Shipper about September 27; Manchester Trader, about October 25; and the Manchester Spinner about November 26. These steamers will take a general cargo and live stock at the low rates. A. Pickard & Co. are the agents here and any information required will be cheerfully furnished by them.

The marriage took place yesterday morning at the residence of George H. and Mrs. Foster, Rockford Street, when their youngest daughter, Miss Julia S. Blaisdell, bride of Robert S. Blaisdell, son of Rev. Mr. Blaisdell, pastor of the Methodist Church at Port Hood, C. B. The wedding was a quiet one, the ceremony being performed by the groom's father in the presence only of the immediate relatives of the contracting parties. The couple were unattended. The bride was becomingly and tastefully gown-ed in white silk and her traveling suit was of a very pretty and fashionable blue. Numerous presents, handsome and valuable were received. The happy couple left by the Northumberland yesterday morning for their future home in Port Hood.

The Standard Oil Company are planning big things for Charlottetown and this Province in connection with their business interests here. They have purchased from Vachere Gay a portion of property on the outskirts of the city, adjacent to the Experimental Farm and here they intend erecting two immense oil tanks. These tanks will each have a capacity of 300,000 gallons. These tanks will be connected by a line of six inch pipe running from the Railway Wharf. E. W. Nickerson, contractor of the Construction Department of the company is in the city to superintend the work of laying this pipe, which work will commence immediately. The whole undertaking to be completed this Fall. The oil will be brought here in tank steamers from New York and will be discharged direct from the steamers by automatic power into the big supply tanks. The oil will be distributed over the Province in special tank cars which are now being constructed. Smaller tanks will be placed at the various central points along the line and the oil will be sent out from these in tank wagons to dealers wherever required. This undertaking will mean a big thing for Charlottetown and the Province in general. The erection of the immense tanks, power house and stable, pipe line, tank cars will mean an outlay of many thousands of dollars.
