**STALLION ENROLMENT**

According to the provisions of the Stallion Enrolment Act all stallions two years old and over, standing for service in this Province, must be enrolled in the records of the Department of Agriculture. Horses offering for service must be inspected and graded, and carry an inspection certificate. Applications for enrolment and inspection should be made immediately.

Applications for enrolment should be accompanied with the required fee of Two Dollars (\$2.00) and should include name of horse, breed, age, colour, description and Registration Number, if horse is registered.

Stallion owners who use horses for service not enrolled, or inspected or in grades not authorized by the Act will be subject to the penalty provisions of the above mentioned Act. Only horses enrolled, graded and authorized by the Department of Agriculture will be permitted to travel for public service. All horses that have graded "out" will not be permitted to stand or travel for service.

**Livestock**

**MONTREAL, April 8 (CP)—**Calves were 20 cents lower and hogs after a low and uncertain start, and cattle were steady today on the livestock markets.

Good quality steers were weighed in at 12.75-13.25 with a few tops going up to 13.75. Mediums were \$11.25-12.50 and common down to \$9. Butchers were 7.50-11.50. Good butcher cows were 9.50-10 with an odd sale a shade higher. Common butchers were 7.8. Canners and cutters were 5-6.75. Good butcher bulls were 9.50 to a top of 11.50. Commoner kinds were 7.50-9.25.

Veal calves made 9 to a top of 14.50, the bulk of the sales being at 11.25-12.50. In the hog division grade A brought 19.50-19.75 with a few sales at 20; 59 local butchers. Sows were 17-18 dressed, a few local truck lambs sold at 12-13. One spring lamb weighing 40 lbs live weight went at 10. Sheep were 4-9.

**Stock Markets At A Glance**

**WINNIPEG, April 8 (CP)—**An erratic display was given by rye futures by trading on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange today.

Buying orders which found the market steady after a brief decline boosted May and July the five cent limit during the first half of the session, but purchases dropped off towards the close.

**CHICAGO, April 8 (AP)—**May rye moved well ahead most of the day, but closed on a decline, strong short covering demand and stop loss buying.

Wheat, corn and barley were up the five-cent limit delivery was up a single day's trading at \$2.84 1-4 a bushel, another 25-year peak price. All other deliveries of the grain remained at \$1.46 1-2 ceiling.

Wheat, corn and barley finished again at dealings of \$1.81 1-2, \$1.21 1-2 and \$1.26 1-2. Oats were unchanged to 7-8 cents lower.

**TORONTO, April 8 (CP)—**Stocks developed a soft note in the afternoon period of Toronto Exchange trading as index losses were showing for all groups at the close. Base Metals were heavy today.

Weakness of the base metal stocks developed chiefly in the senior list. Smelters slipped 1-3-3 and Hudson Bay and Noranda lost 1-2. Labrador slipped off 5 cents to 8.90 and mild weakness was registered by Falconbridge, Golden Manitou, Normetal and Sherritt, Penn Orelle and Waite. Amulco gained by Falconbridge.

Amulco stood out in the action, trading 453,000 shares on an advance of 11 cents to close at \$1. North Star closed at 90 for a net gain of 6 cents.
