Bracken Policies Aimed To Correct Injustices Says Mr. W. C. S. McLure

Following is the text of an address delivered last night by Mr. W. Chester S. McLure on behalf of the Progressive Conservative Party... "V-E Day is here—a reality at last. Thank God for the victory that has ended the armed forces... We give thanks to those in our Nation, those of the Allied Nations, to the countless heroes among them, and women of our country who faced capture, faced crippling injury, and faced death to make our freedom and mine secure. To those heroes we bow in sincere gratitude."

"To those who made the supreme sacrifice, and passed on the right of men by the paths of duty, I have no words adequate to express my thanks and devotion... While the Japanese war has yet to be fought to the end, attention is directed to Germany, attention is directed to the post-war and regards transportation to and from the mainland, so that this Island Province would become an integral part of the Dominion of Canada... In view of the fact that there was no money expended on war industries in Prince Edward Island, and that very little in the way of industry is carried on in this Province, outside of farming and fishing, it is agreed that the Progressive Conservative Government, under the Premiership of Hon. John Bracken and his associates, will construct an entirely Dominion Government project, a super highway from Borden to Charlottetown, including the national West and North Rivers, as an extension of the national highway."

Stettinius Sees U. S. In Mediator Role In World

SAN FRANCISCO, May 28 (AP)—State Secretary Stettinius chose the role of mediator among the major nations, in a five-point declaration of report on the United Nations conference. In an address punctuated by a warning to Argentina to put democratic principles into practice at home, Mr. Stettinius called on Britain, Russia, France and China to reach an early "common understanding" on such vexing problems as establishment of a new Polish Government.
