the \$74.37 that the child MIGHT HAVE EARNED.

Teacher from East Kings and Don Marx, where is your sense of humor? Can you not see the veiled sarcasm in the above?

It reminds me of the man that was defending the Government the other day over the increase in their own wages.

His line of talk ran something like this: "Why should not the Government increase their own salaries, there are only four hundred and thirty schools on the Island, and they increased the teachers' salaries fifty thousand dollars, whereas they only increased their own by about twenty thousand dollars and here ARE THIRTY OF THEM."

The reference to the poll tax only draws attention to the fact that most of our teachers are young ladies and would not have to pay poll taxes in any case, surely some concession to the profession.

Could anything be better put than, "nearly all the Teachers are free from paying taxes on their property"; Why? Because the Government does not pay them enough salary to keep themselves in comfort let alone invest in property for the few that have to pay taxes on property have had it left to them, as they never could have earned it at teaching.

And for being free from paying income tax, how could it be otherwise when they have no taxable income.

Only a short time ago a member of the Government was credited with saying "the taxes were not going to be so high, for three dollars now is not worth more than one dollar was before the war." If this is the case and I think it is, how can the Government honestly refuse to pay the teachers more money so that they can take up teaching as a profession and make it a life work, for then and only then will we get the best class of teachers. I have no fault to find with young teachers but the truth is that they only teach for a few years in most cases, and when they are just getting properly trained for the profession they are compelled to forsake it because they cannot afford to do anything else.

I am a tax payer, and let me say this, the vast majority of the people on Prince Edward Island do not object to paying taxes, if they know they are going to be honestly spent for the betterment of their children and roads, but I for one do object to having my hard earned money legally stolen as was done by the Local Government this spring.

I am glad to see that at least three of our men, Brodie, A. E. McLean and Irving refused to sign the "Round Robin." All the members knew what the session allowance was to be before they were elected; living has not taken such a jump since last fall as to warrant their making a raid on the cash register, especially after we had been told there was no money to pay the teachers or fix the roads.


