..*TUBERCULOSIS TEST.—Dr. P. S. McDonald is testing a number of herds of cattle as to their freedom from tuberculosis. It is understood the Federal Government does not pay for this work but will supply the serum for the test. The owners of herds make their own agreement with Dr. McDonald. Some herds are found not to be immune.—S.
