THE TROUBLE IN MOROCCO.

Our despatches of late have several times referred to troubles in Morocco in a way that may not be easy of understanding to many of our readers without some explanation. Morocco occupies the north-west corner of Africa, just across the straits of Gibraltar. It has an area of 220,000 square miles and a population variously estimated at four to nine millions. The Sultan, Mulai Abdal Aziz is the spiritual as well as the civil head of the Empire and has absolute power. He is not quite twenty-five years of age and has occupied the throne since he was twenty years of age. He is an intelligent ruler and having learned that modern methods of government tend to peace and prosperity among the people as well as improving the standing of their rulers, he set out to introduce certain very much needed reforms. And it is as a reformer that he has got into trouble.

He first reorganised the prison system which was in a barbarous and horrible condition. Many horrible cruelties before practiced have been prohibited. Before the reforms were instituted jailors as well as other officials extorted by terrorism what they could from their victims and gave a part to the Government. About a year ago the Sultan invited the Governors and Deputy Governors to meet him and informed them that hereafter they would be paid regular salaries, and that the practices of bribery and extortion must cease. He also issued an edict establishing free trade in place of the previous restrictions upon commerce. He also sought to bring about better relations between his Mohammedan and Christian subjects, which was a very difficult task. Two or three months ago a Mohammedan religious fanatic from the country districts arrived in the Moorish capital and without provocation proceeded to kill the first Christian he met. The victim happened to be a missionary doctor. The assassin was seized and brought before the Sultan who ordered his instant execution.

Prison reform, free trade and even-handed justice are good things in their place, but the trouble was that the Moors, and especially the official class, do not want to be reformed. They prefer the old privileges of extortion and bribery. So it falls out that in his efforts to suppress official corruption and oppression the Sultan has incurred the anger of a large number of his people. An insurrection has been raised by a Pretender, and the Sultan, at recent accounts, was closely shut up in the sacred city of Fez. The rebels appear to be in practical possession of the country outside.

The Minister of Justice who advises the Cabinet in constitutional matters has prepared a statement as a basis for the new Redistribution Bill to be passed at the approaching session of Parliament. He advises that the new House of Commons, after the Act shall go into force will consist of 210 members instead of 214 as at present. Ontario will lose six members, Nova Scotia two, New Brunswick one and P. E. Island one; while Manitoba will gain three, British Columbia one and the Territories two. It will be observed that the Minister of Justice takes no notice of the Maritime Province claim of right to retain the full quota of representation which they had on entering the union.

TRACOMA INVALIDS.

St. John, Dec. 31.—The steamer Lake Ontario will on her eastward trip take back to England many immigrants whom the new inspector, Dr. Ellis, finds suffering with tracoma. Dr. Ellis reports over sixty in all, but the steamship company are sending some to hospitals in expectation of their early recovery.

LADY LAURIER PUT BACK.

OTTAWA, December 29.—A cable to the marine department to-day announced that the government steamer Lady Laurier, which sailed from Glasgow on December 23rd, put back into that port to-day under stress of weather for repairs. The nature of the damage to the vessel is not known.
