Ontario Brief From Milk Distributors

TORONTO, Dec. 12—(CP)—Ontario Milk Distributors' Association in a brief submitted to the Royal Commission on milk today said that the "increase in the consumer price of milk from 11 cents a unit in June to 16 cents in October resulted in a decrease in the volume of sales which in turn has increased the unit costs of processing the distribution."

The brief added that "this added cost will equal or even exceed the insignificant benefit which the price raise conferred on milk distributors." The association said its membership handled 75 per cent of the total fluid milk business in Ontario.

It was "regrettable" that public use of milk should be less than public need, the brief said. It adds that "the price of milk to the consumer advanced from 11 cents to 13 cents in June but no part of this increase went to the benefit of either dairy farmer or distributor—the Dominion Government alone got any benefit in that it saved the consumer subsidy of two cents a quart, or, put differently, the consumers as taxpayers got the benefit."

Senator Davis Takes Up Cudgels

LIVERPOOL, Dec. 12—(CP)—Senator W. Rupert Davies, publisher of the Kingston Whig-Standard, who sailed for Canada today, protested in a letter to the Liverpool Post about the Post's reporting of the return of United Kingdom "disillusioned" brides of Canadian servicemen.

Senator Davies referred specifically to a front-page story on the docking of the liner Cavina which was headed: "Heartbreak ship here once more; brides again back from Canada."

In his letter, Senator Davies said the story gave an inaccurate picture of living conditions in Canada and suggested "instead of plastering a three-column heading on your front page about disillusionment of a few returning brides you try to find out something about the thousands of English girls who have come out to Canada during the past two years and who have found there, happiness and contentment."

N.B. Potato Growers Urge Federal Action

HARTLAND, N. B., Dec. 12—(CP)—A resolution urging Federal action to assure New Brunswick potato growers a fair return on their 1946 crops has been adopted at the annual meeting of the Hartland Agricultural Society.

The resolution stated that owing to heavy over-production of potatoes in Canada, combined with loss of a starch factory in this area, growers could market only a small part of the crop and that at prices below the cost of production.

The present stabilization program is due to start May 1 and this was declared too late to assist in marketing of potatoes from this area.

Says Plague Of Communism Falls On Many Localities

TORONTO, Dec. 11—(CP)—C. E. Carlisle, president of the Dominion Bank, told the annual meeting of shareholders today that the "poisonous plague of Communism has fallen on many localities in Canada and to a greater extent than many people are aware of."

Comparing conditions in democratic countries with those in Russia, Mr. Carlisle said it was difficult to understand why anyone would prefer Communism and Russia's standard of living in place of the privileges enjoyed by Canadians.

Dealing with labor disputes, Mr. Carlisle said the strike weapon was being overworked. Labor unions were essential and under proper leadership, could be of special assistance in the betterment of production and service but by referring industrial disputes to the courts great inconvenience and loss to the people could be avoided.

In many respects the last fiscal year was the most successful in the bank's history. It had opened new branches and had purchased property as sites for other branches.

Robert Rae, general manager of the bank, reviewed its latest financial statement, indicating a strong liquid position, growing total deposits and expansion of commercial loans. Current loans reached a total of \$58,500,000, an increase of \$24,500,000 over the previous fiscal year. Net profit was \$860,768, against \$1,089,383 for the previous year.

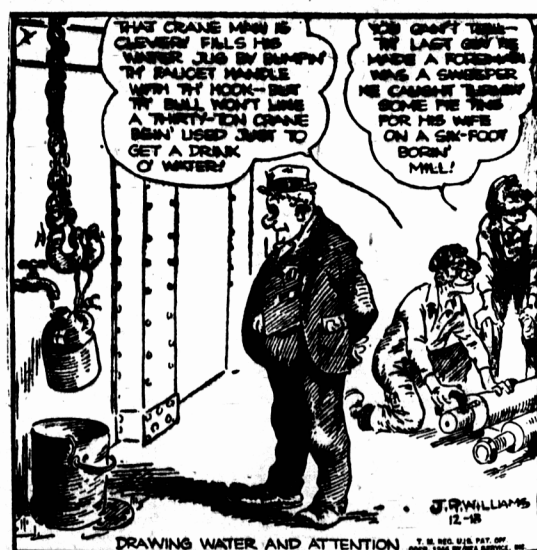

LENGTHEN LIFE OF GOOD WOOLS

Woolly winter blankets will better insulate you against frosty nips if you treat them gently and keep them clean. Most common fault stretches covers out of line.

of housewives, claims one manufacturer—who says a blanket could have as many lives as a cat if it were treated properly—is blanket-yanking when beds are made. This practice breaks down fibers and stretches covers out of line.

Here are more reminders to paste on your closet door, which if heeded will lengthen the life of these cherished woolies:

1. Whisk out loose dirt and dust regularly with a broom to keep blanket's insulation at peak efficiency. But always brush towards the bindings, never crosswise.

2. Bindings should be fresh and clean. They can be sudsed with a mild soap and stains rubbed out with a soft brush without wetting the entire blanket. Iron bindings, but never try to press the blanket.
