Winnipeg, Man., Sept. 24—British wants to keep its position as a major world fur auctioneer, despite the present financial crisis, and the British government has taken steps to ensure that raw furs will continue to be imported freely, according to Sir Patrick Ashley Cooper, governor of the Hudson's Bay Co.

This does not mean that Britain will be able to buy more furs for themselves. On the contrary, un-

der the current austerly program, the use of furs for dress in Britain is very slight, Sir Patrick said, pointing out that rationing and the use of coupons alone puts a great restriction on the use of furs there.

"I don't think the dollar crisis will make any material difference to the volume of furs we handle in London," he said. "When the recent crisis broke and the government restricted imports by applying special licenses, they asked the auction houses of the Hudson's Bay Co. to continue sales as usual, pending readjustments that would be made to enable to continue importation of furs freely in Britain," Sir Patrick explained.

**TIMELY NOTES ON TOPICS CONNECTED WITH**

**Silver Fox and Mink Farming**

Dr. C.K. Gunn, Superintendent Experimental Fox Ranch, Summerside, has gone to a great deal of trouble to compile a complete feeding ration for mink with percentages and feeding hints that are most valuable. He has also written a treatise on the breeding of mink listed as follows: (a). The mating procedure; (b). Methods of breeding mink to obtain desired fur qualities, such as line breeding, inbreeding and the selection of breeding stock; (c). Genetics of some mutant types of mink. All the above subjects are carefully gone into and explained in easily understood language. In this work we consider that Dr. Gunn has produced a very valuable guide for those who wish to engage in mink farming or who are already producing mink. We presume copies are available on application to Dr. Gunn, at the Experimental Fox Ranch, Summerside.
