TRADE STATEMENT REPORT.

OTTAWA, Oct. 19.—The trade statement for the first half of the fiscal year showed a total six months trade of \$304,490,088, an increase of \$43,221,436, compared with the same period last year.

The annual report of the Ministry of Public Works shows an expenditure last year of \$14,750,000 of which \$3,225,000 was spent on harbors and rivers and \$4,500,000 on dredging, while \$6,000,000 was spent on public buildings.

The English firm of Swan & Hunter has been applied for a statutory subsidy of 3 per cent on a cost up to \$1,500,000 on a floating dry dock they propose to build at Vancouver. It will have a capacity of 11,000 tons to be built in England, shipped in parts and assembled in Vancouver.

AVIATOR'S DARING FEAT.

PARIS, Oct. 19.—Count De Lambert, French aviator, just before dark, accomplished one of the most remarkable and daring flights yet to the credit of heavier than air machines.

Starting from the Aerodrome at Juvisy, he flew to Paris, a distance of thirteen miles. After manoeuvring over the city at an average height of 400 feet, he ascended in gradually diminishing circles and passed several hundred feet above the Eiffel Tower. He then returned to Juvisy.
