Jamaica Maroons 200 Years Free Mark Anniversary

KINGSTON, Jamaica, May 4—(CP)—Just 200 years ago five runaway slaves had what may be termed to Sir Charles Lyttelton, Governor of Jamaica, the colossal effort to approach that victory with a draft for a treaty.

The slaves, who called themselves Captain's Children, Accompong, Quaco, Johnny and Cuffee, must have had what it took to deal with the Governor for a treaty was concluded.

The treaty provided for the granting of complete freedom for the negroes, who, because of their color, were dubbed "Maroons" by the white people.

This year the Accompong group, largest Maroon settlement on the island, celebrated the bicentennial of the treaty.

The present chief of Accompong, responsible for the management of the colony, is 70-year-old Colonel Henry Augustus Rowe who took an active part in the celebrations.

(C.P. By Guardian's Special Wire) EDMONTON, May 2—Paroled on order of Hon. Ernest Lapointe, Minister of Justice, George Frederick Powell was released from Fort Saskatchewan jail today after serving about half his six-month term for publishing defamatory articles.

1938 River Freshet Is Uneventful

FREDERICTON, May 3—Spring freshets of the St. John river are welcomed by people in the low-lying Mauterville and the surrounding area. The water does not rise too high. Silt left by the annual flood makes the area one of the richest agricultural sections in the province.

No damage was caused by the freshet this spring. The river was unusually low when it broke up and ran to the sea. Residents were relieved to escape a repetition of the disastrous flood of 1936, when hundreds were marooned and even the basement of the parliament buildings here was flooded. An ice jam on the river at Mauterville, a smaller stream, consequently when the water rises the residents have no avenue for their farm animals and always inundated them and fast flowing ice precludes crossing the river.

The people just have to stay and hope the water won't rise too high. They have learned to erect stanchions for livestock, have floors and mark walls to avoid stepping into them while wading in flood waters. So far as can be remembered, the river has never claimed a life in the district.
