THE Halifax Chronicle says: Capt. Allan Finlayson, of Charlottetown, is at the Queen, en route to Glasgow to bring out the new government steamer Minto, which he will command. Capt. Finlayson has been in charge of government boats performing winter service between the Island and the mainland for many years. He commanded the Northern Light, the first government steamer in that service. The crew for the Minto is composed entirely of Island men. They are all in the city and will accompany Capt. Finlayson to Glasgow. The other officers are, Capt. John McPherson, 1st officer; Capt. Alex McLeod, 2nd officer; Herbert Clarke, 2nd engineer; E. S. Meahan, 3rd engineer. The contractors will supply the first engineer.

NOTES OF MURRAY RIVER AND VICINITY.—Haying is about finished in this locality. The crop is lighter than last year but is of good quality.—Several burglaries have been committed in this vicinity within the last few months. One was on Sunday August 6th when Mr and Mrs. Humphrey Moore of Toronto, Lot 64, were away to church, their house was opened and a sum of money belonging to the school, and some other articles were stolen. A trunk and chest of drawers were broken open to get the money. There is no clue as to who committed any of the thefts.—Work on the Baptist Church at Murray River Bridge is progressing rapidly. Several other buildings have been erected there this summer and Mr. Thomas Cook is preparing to build a new street in the vicinity of Murray River Bridge.—Mrs. Bella Nickerson, the oldest inhabitant died at the residence of her niece Mrs. John Lowe on the 10th inst. She was about 104 years old, and until she had an attack of grippe last winter was smart and able to work.—Mrs. Archibald Munn also died on the 10th and was taken to the Cemetery in Brooklyn Lot 61 for burial.—Mr. and Mrs. Charles Moore of Providence, R. I., are visiting their friends in Toronto. Mr. John T. Hugh, proprietor of the Stanley House, Pictou, N. S., has been visiting his parents and old friends, at Murray Harbor this week.—Mr. E. M. Henderson, of the employ of Honston & Henderson, Boston paid a flying visit to his friends in Murray River and Murray Harbor this week.—Miss Percy M. Richards who has spent the last three months among her friends here returned to her home in Boston this week. She took with her her nephew master Fred Richard.

THE St. John Telegraph says:—When C. P. R. harvest excursion train reached here this morning, it had to be divided into two trains, being too heavy for handling as one body. Nearly all the excursionists are stalwart, well set up young men. A crowd of American tourists who happened to be in the depot when the train arrived, were loud in praise of the appearance of the Nova Scotia and P. E. Island excursionists.

A CORRESPONDENT of the Halifax Herald says: Of all the country traversed by the Midland railway, the pushing, enterprising, live town of Truro probably expects most from it, and likely will receive most. Truro is the eastern terminus of the Midland but not only that but a railroad centre of great importance. Truro proposes that she shall not remain merely the terminus of the Midland any longer than is absolutely necessary. Her people are saying that the Midland railway should be extended to Brule, a Northumberland strait port in this county, only 28 miles distant. From Truro to Charlottetown via Brule is not much further than from Truro to Pictou alone. This shows what an advantage to through travellers to P. E. Island would follow, were there a railway to Brule with a steamer leaving there for P. E. Island. A short railway journey and a brief water trip would save much time and avoid much annoyance. To be strictly accurate, the distance from Truro to Charlottetown via Brule is only three miles greater than from Truro to Pictou. In the several estimates there appears a vote of \$12,000 for a wharf at Brule. An extension of the Midland to that point therefore, and the consequent shortening of the distance to P. E. Island and may be set down for the not distant future. A charter has been obtained and a preliminary survey made for the North Colchester railway, to accomplish this short route to the Island and open up intervening country. Among the names mentioned in the charter are those of J. A. Leaman, Dr. McKay, Gardiner Clish and others.

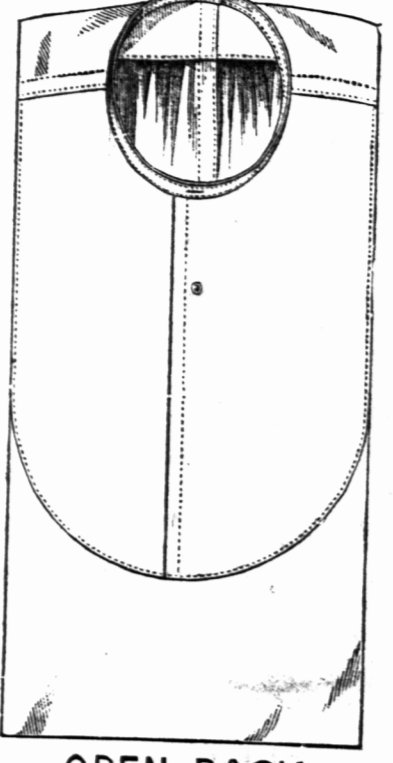

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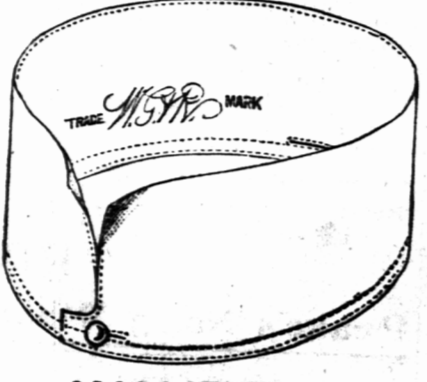
