**The Late Mr. Francois Joseph Buote**

By the passing of Mr. Francois Joseph Buote, whose death occurred at Tignish, on Friday October the 20th, a well known Island journalist has departed.

The late Mr. Buote was born at Tignish on November the 2nd, 1861, and was therefore in the 61st year of his age. He was a son of Gilbert Buote and Madeline Gallant. He was educated at the University of New Brunswick, Fredericton, St. Louis College and St. Dunstan's University. He married Miss Marie Gougen, and their only child, Miss Alma, is an artist of some note.

Mr. Buote was the publisher of "L'Impartial" from its inception in 1891 and besides his newspaper he conducted a general printing establishment. At the time of his death, Mr. Buote was interested in the Fox industry with his headquarters at Montreal.

At midnight on the date of his demise, he was stricken with paralysis and his spirit passed away at 6.30 o'clock in the morning. He never recovered consciousness. Up to that time he had been enjoying excellent health and appeared to have many years of usefulness still before him. He had arrived home from Montreal on Monday night last and intended returning to the great Canadian metropolis with his wife and daughter the following Monday.

The late Mr. Buote was widely known and favorably regarded in his native province. He took an especially active interest in public affairs and during the elections, especially in Prince County he was generally one of the leading speakers and one of the most active workers in the Liberal cause.

He was not only exceptionally well informed on public matters, but was a man of considerable distinction in the estimation of the Acadian population of this province. His untimely death, for he was still in the prime of life, will be deeply regretted for his friendliness made him welcome amongst all classes and creeds.

He is survived by his wife and daughter to whom the sympathy of all will go forth.

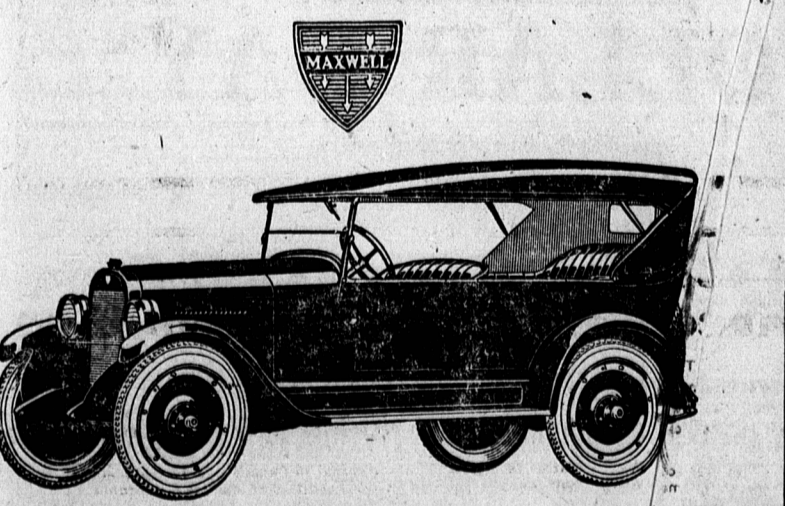
