It is not usually wise to select a trump lead against small-slam contracts, because this loses what experts call a "tempo" in plain

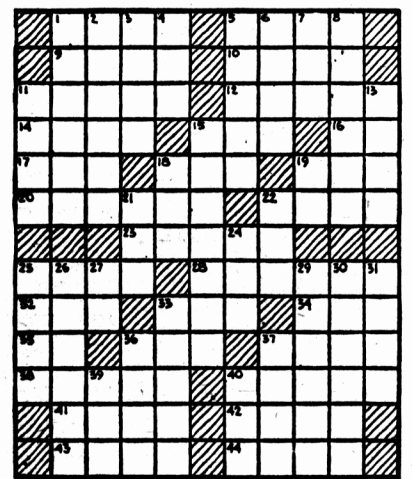
North's five-club bid was somewhat of a "push" in view of his previous jump raise, but the final contract was certainly not to be greatly criticized.
