CONSERVATIVES IN CONVENTION

At Summerside Nominate a Candidate

To Contest Riding of Prince County at the General Election A. A. Lefurgey Was the Choice.

The meeting of the Liberal Conservative Convention of East and West Prince County held in Market Hall yesterday afternoon was a very large and representative one there being about one hundred and seventy delegates present.

Dr. P. C. Murphy, Tignish acted as chairman. A motion to organize a Liberal Conservative Association for Prince County was passed but reconsidered as it was thought best to leave the work divided as it has been.

The matter of nomination was the next question. Edward Hackett M. F., was the first to speak. The Government had deeded Prince County but one member and the people of West Prince had come to nominate one candidate by a unanimous vote. He moved that A. A. Lefurgey, M. F., be the candidate. The motion was seconded by M. C. Delaney, North Tryon. The motion was carried by a unanimous and enthusiastic standing vote. Three cheers were then given for Mr. Hackett, Amid cheers the president then declared Mr. Lefurgey the Liberal Conservative candidate by what he believed was the largest and most unanimous vote ever taken in this Province.

Mr. Lefurgey addressed the Convention first thanking the delegates for the honor conferred upon him. He eulogised his co-

BRITISH PAPERS ARE REJOICING

Over the Agreement Between Russia and Japan

Arrested on Suspicion Follows—Death Claims Bishop Leonard of Utah and Cyrus Edon of New York.

NEW YORK, Dec. 3.—(Special)—Dr. Cyrus Edon, son of former Mayor Franklin Edson, died to-day of pneumonia, aged forty-six years.

He was born at Albany, N. Y., and was the inventor of many useful surgical instruments.

BISHOP LEONARD DEAD. SALT LAKE, Dec. 3.—(Special)—Bishop Abel Leonard, head of the Episcopal church in Utah and Nevada died to-day of typhoid fever.

BODIES OF AGED COUPLE FOUND. BUFFALO, Dec. 3.—(Special)—The bodies of Franz Frehr and wife an aged couple who disappeared on Nov. 2nd, were found buried in the yard back of their house.

AN ARREST FOR THE MURDER. They had been murdered, the skulls of both being crushed. Charles Bonier, aged 65 who moved into the house the day the Frehrs disappeared has been arrested, also some accomplices.

By Montreal Board of Trade to Purchase Miquelon

Quebec's Twenty Shoe Factories Will Resume—C. P. R. Bond Sales—Legislature Meets—Mission Workers Scarce.

TO PURCHASE MIQUELON. MONTREAL, Dec. 3.—(Special)—The Board of Trade has decided to urge upon the Canadian Government the purchase of the Miquelon Islands which France is said to be willing to sell.

C. P. R. BONDS SELLING WELL. A special cable from London announces that the C. P. R. has placed from \$2,000,000 to \$3,000,000 of 4 per cent debenture bonds on the British market at from 106 to 109.

QUEBEC SHOE FACTORIES TO RESUME. QUEBEC, Dec. 3.—(Special)—The machinists have definitely decided to sign an agreement prepared by the shoe manufacturers.

This means that the deadlock is broken and the immediate resumption of operations in twenty factories in this city.

MORE MISSION STUDENTS WANTED. TORONTO, Dec. 3.—(Special)—The Presbyterian Church is facing a serious problem in the scarcity of men for winter work in mission fields, so many mission students attend the colleges in winter.

SPECIAL SESSION OF LEGISLATURE. HALIFAX, Dec. 3.—(Special)—The special session of the local Legislature to pass the legislation bearing on the Dominion Coal and Dominion Iron and Steel Companies opened this afternoon.
