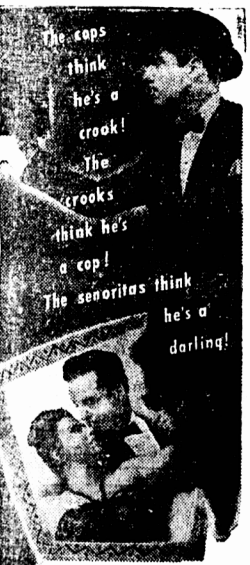

SCIENTIFIC TEMPERANCE INSTRUCTION (This is a vigorous challenge sent by Mrs. Purke Provincial T. I. Superintendent, with the outline of studies for this year.) Dear W. C. T. U. Workers: Again it is ours to meet the challenge provided by the Liquor Traffic, that we may help stay the hydra-headed monster, ALCOHOL which stalks abroad with stealthy feet in our world today, breathing emmsic poison gases wherever our young people are passing. Do we heed the righteous call? Do we need to be told that all the loss of our youth are in danger? This is one "atom bomb" that no nation is trying to keep a secret. These business concerns are so effectively organized that the subservient minions work the clock around. If we do less, theirs will be the winning in competitive measure. Keep it! Pray without ceasing, and be our motto: "No faith without works." A great lecturer once thundered from the platform: "Either selfishness or ignorance or both combined cause all the trouble there is in the world." There is too painfully much truth in his statement for us to allow ourselves to "bog down" in either. The way to frustrate the liquor traffic is to educate, so to inform our school children that none of them will become brands to be plucked from the burning, but that each one of them may be upright, facing the rising sun of TRUTH. The drugged cigarettes and alcohol-tainted candies that the tobacco business and the liquor interests stand through which to supply children well represent the evil communications that corrupt good manners. But we can offset the effect of the "materialistic binge" indulged in by the present generation, stated Rev. T. M. Badger. A sense of purpose and a grip upon spiritual forces are a better remedy for boredom than social drinking. Alcohol Studies is not, as some suggest, the tool of the liquor interests, Rev. Bruce Johnson said in one of the reports adding the school had a grant of several hundred thousand dollars from a liquor firm when it was hard-pressed financially. Mr. Johnson spoke of his training at the summer session of the Yale school.

ALCOHOL IN THE BIBLE In the Old Testament, we find God directing Jonah to go to Nineveh, the capital of Assyria, and preach to the king and the people against their great wickedness. And we find the prophet Nahum prophesying the complete destruction of Nineveh, which actually came to pass in 606 B. C. That the substance cannot separate the good from the bad all have to be burned, so the people of Nineveh, because of the extent of sin and drunkenness everywhere, the whole city had to be destroyed. (Nahum 1:10) Sin destroyed the sin of drunkenness has ever been a downward pull in the lives of men and of nations. Our prayer is that day may soon come when sin in all its forms will be thrown off in our land and the words of Paul be applicable to every one of us: "But now being made free from sin, and become servants to God, ye have your fruit unto holiness, and the end thereof is the life. For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is

eternal life through Jesus Christ, our Lord"-Romans 6:22-23. Lincoln once said: "The liquor traffic is a cancer in society, eating out its vitality and threatening destruction, and all attempts to regulate it will not only prove abortive but will aggravate the evil. It must be eradicated."
