**"ISLANDERS' DAY."**

It ought to have been mentioned in connection with our remarks of a few days ago on the Old Home Week proposal that Summerside made the first move in this matter some months ago. While making tardy mention of the fact our friends both east and west will be glad to note evidences of increasing favor for the proposal on every hand. At this season of the year many of our exiles are returning and the very air is vocal with cordial greetings and welcomes for the homecomers. It had been proposed to wait till another year for the full inauguration of the week of welcome, but the Whelan Monument Committee have, wisely, we think, resolved to anticipate by holding an Islander's Day on 10th July, and turn it to account for the furtherance of the worthy object they have in hand. Many of the homecomers will be visiting their old homes at that time and others, even at short notice, may be able to make their arrangements to come.

The purpose is to hold on the day named a grand demonstration on the C. A. A. Park, Charlottetown, at which many and varied attractions will be presented. As will be seen by advertisement in another column a good variety of athletic competitions will be provided, together with good music and addresses by popular orators from home and abroad. Reduced rates on the railway will stimulate the coming of a multitude, and the gathering will afford the best opportunities for the reunion of old friends, too long separated. Best of all those attending will be able to contribute to the support of the Whelan Monument Fund. We have now our Soldiers' Monument. Next in order will come fittingly a monument to a prominent worthy and eloquent public man who won distinction in the walks of peace by faithful and eminent services. We believe that the proposal will meet with a cordial response from all classes and creeds and confidently hope that the coming demonstration may meet with abundant success.

A third bronze tablet, to contain the names of all the Islanders who took part in the South African war was a part of the original design. The committee would be glad yet to see this object carried out if the funds are forthcoming.

Many will feel regret that his departure from life's activities will prevent the attendance at the ceremonial today, of the late Hon. D. Farquharson, who had been chairman of the Citizens' Committee and took a very sincere and active interest in the monument.
