DECORATED.—A pleasing ceremony was performed by His Honor Lieutenant Rogers in the Charlottetown Railway waiting rooms yesterday afternoon when he presented Mr. Daniel Montgomery, retired station agent, now residing in Summerside, with the Imperial Service Medal, which has been conferred upon him in recognition of long and meritorious public service as a railroad man. Mr. Montgomery was in the railroad service from 1875 to 1913—35 years. The decoration was pinned to the breast of his coat by His Honor, who prefaced that duty with a few appreciative eulogistic remarks.

RETURNING FROM RUSSIA.—A cable received by Mr. J. Walter Jones states that Dr. Young, the well known Karakul sheep expert, was expected to leave Liban, Russia, last Monday, en route for America. Dr. Young expected to take passage in a German or an English ship. But whether the breaking out of hostilities has interfered with his program is as yet unknown.

RIFLE SHOOTING.—The spoon shoot for the members of the Civilian Rifle Club this afternoon at Kensington range, will begin at two o'clock and will be at the 200, 500 and 600 yards ranges. Three silver spoons will be awarded each in the first and second classes, and the previous winners of spoons will be handicapped four points each. Blunt ammunition will be used this afternoon. On Monday, when there will be another spoon shoot—at the long ranges, 800 and 900 yards—either the blunt or pointed ammunition may be used.

NEW AMERICAN CONSUL.—Dr. T. Livingston Mays, the new American Consul, has arrived in Charlottetown from New Orleans, La., accompanied by Mrs. Mays and family of the following sketch of the Doctor appears in the World, of Louisville, Ky.: "Dr. Livingston Mays, of Columbia, Tenn., has decided definitely to accept the office tendered by President Wilson as United States Consul to Canada, and enters upon his new duties in July. Dr. Mays is a native of Texas, is forty years of age, a graduate of Round Rock College, and of the Southern Theological Seminary, having taken the degree of Th.D. at the latter institution in 1900 with the predicate, magna cum laude. He has held pastorates in Austin, Houston, Texas and New Orleans, La., and has also been financial agent of two other churches. He has also kept closely in touch with general business conditions, having been President of commercial clubs in the various cities in which he has resided."

AN IMPORTANT LINE.—The New Brunswick and P. E. I. railway line which the Government is negotiating for the purchase of, to co-operate with the I. C. R. in relation to the car ferry service to the Island, is an important one, and is about thirty-six miles in length and now has daily service. There are several important industries along the line, and large shipments of lumber are made from all along the I. C. R. The leading shareholders in the company are the estate of the late Charles Pickard; C. Fred Fawcett, of Sackville, and M. G. Siddall, of Port George. The price of the road was not mentioned, but the owners say that General Manager Gutelius drove a hard bargain. The road was originally promoted by Lieutenant-Governor Josiah Wood, who sold out his interest subsequently. The acquisition of this road was essential in connection with the new car ferry service to be established between Cape Tormentine in New Brunswick, and Carleton Point on the Island, and the practical rebuilding of the railroad on the Island as a standard gauge road, which will afford the people of the Island, East and West, direct rail connection with the Continent generally. The result, of course, to be greatly improved and brought up to the intercolonial standard. This would be essential to the through traffic, but such an unproved road will also be of great local benefit to the country through which it runs; and it will be a valuable and revenue-producing addition to the Government railway system.
