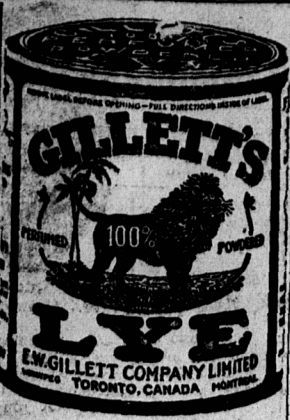

Woman Murdered Near Tatamagouche

TATAMAGOUCHE, Colchester County, Jan 10 - Mrs. Alice Tattler, the wife of Joseph Tattler, from here, was shot and killed at noon yesterday. Her husband is charged with the crime by two daughters who were eye witnesses to their mother's death. When placed under arrest he gave the reason for the crime as a self-defense. At the inquest nothing to substantiate that as a motive was brought out, and the verdict of the jury was that Mrs. Tattler came to her death from a bullet from a gun in the hands of her husband. She was shot in the left breast by a bullet from a .38 Smith and Wesson revolver. The coroner's jury had two witnesses only before it - the two daughters of the dead woman and the man charged with murder. They both testified that their father had killed their mother, but were unable to give any details. They were exceedingly hysterical and any other evidence which the coroner endeavored to obtain was incoherently given, and led to practically no light on the motive of the crime, whether or not there were extenuating circumstances. The jury led up to the murder of Mrs. Tattler by the murder of his wife at Tatamagouche yesterday afternoon committed suicide this morning by cutting his throat with a pocket knife while on route from Tatamagouche to Truro where he had been jailed. The prisoner was under the charge of Constable McPherson of Tatamagouche asked permission to go to the toilet when leaving Oxford Station, Oxford Junction. While in the toilet the fatal deed was committed. The body was discovered in a dumpy condition passing away on a railway car about twenty minutes after the train reached its destination at Oxford Junction.

An Embargo On Potatoes

ST. JOHN, Jan. 10 - Potato growers and shippers in New Brunswick and Acadia County, Me., who have been hard hit by low prices and unfavorable markets, are facing another setback due to an embargo placed by the Boston & Maine railroad upon all commodities over its lines route to points on the New York, New Haven and Hartford railroad, which outside of the Boston and Albany division of the New York Central and Hudson River railroad controls deliveries throughout southern New England and points south. Upon the Boston and Maine those shipping potatoes to the United States by rail depend, as all cars sent out of Aroostook County by the Canadian Pacific railroad and the Bangor and Aroostook railroad for the United States must pass over the first named system. The same situation exists in this province as to United States-bound cars. The Boston and Maine officials said that the enforcement of an iron-clad embargo is entirely due to the serious accumulation of cars routed to points on or via the New York, New Haven and Hartford railroad. The embargo has caused another decline in potato prices, and the Aroostook Potato Growers' Inc., the central organization of producers, is taking up the matter with the Inter-State Commerce Commission.

Opera Singer's Life Threatened

CHICAGO, Jan. 10 - Tito Schipa, tenor of the Chicago Civic Opera Company, today received a letter in Italian demanding \$50,000 or his life. Other opera singers have been threatened in the same manner recently, it was reported, but Schipa was the first to take it seriously. He delivered his letter to Chief Postal Inspector A. E. Germeo. It was written with pencil on pink paper and signed 'G. I. I. \$50,000 to help our friends. We pray you and your committee to furnish it to us. Not more than three days are given you for this, that is, to raise this amount of money, if you think the communication is a joke you are mistaken. Give us all your consideration. If you refuse, this request calamity will overtake you. Remember you and your comrades will meet death like dogs.'

Canada Must Spend More Money To Get Settlers

LONDON, Jan 10 - Canada must assist emigration from the British Isles by participation with the Imperial Government in the Empire Settlement Act, it is to meet the coming of new citizens. This is the purpose of a resolution passed at the conference of Canadian immigration agents and representatives of the Atlantic steamship companies, which was concluded at the Canadian Immigration Offices here today. Immigration agents from every part of the United Kingdom expressed the conviction that Canada should not combat Australia's state-aided immigration without following her example. The conference was also unanimously of the opinion that more money must be spent on emigration propaganda and advertising.

Canada Admired Now In France

QUEBEC, Jan 10 - The new commercial treaty between France and Canada is the most advantageous which has ever existed between the two countries, according to Hon. Rodolphe Lemieux, Speaker of the House of Commons who is spending a few days here. That the wine regime in this province had been a great asset in the hands of Hon Messrs Fielding and Ernest Lapointe in concluding an advantageous agreement was also his contentions. 'France needs a market for its wines, and I have had the occasion of being present while the negotiations between the Canadian ministers were on to obtain concessions from that country for Canada,' he said. It was an admitted policy in inspired newspapers, like Le Matin, openly to state in their columns: 'Let us favor countries which are ready to buy our wines and then we will buy their paper and their wheat.' The result was that the provinces of Quebec and British Columbia, proving sure clients, the clauses of the treaty were allowed to be most favorable. In addition to this purely commercial aspect and the deep interest existing for our resources, Canada has taken a place in the affection of Frenchmen. This is one of the results of the war. Canada is now known as a great country.'

Reinforcements Arriving In Constantinople

CONSTANTINOPLE, Jan 10 - British air and artillery reinforcements are reported to have arrived here during the past two days. Reliable sources estimate that the arrivals included an entire new brigade of artillery. The report has not served however, to quiet persistent rumors of an impending evacuation. Foreign observers have detected a continued inflowing of Kemalist soldiers dressed in citizens' clothes, who have been militarily equipped after their arrival. It is estimated that more than 20,000 such men are now in the city.

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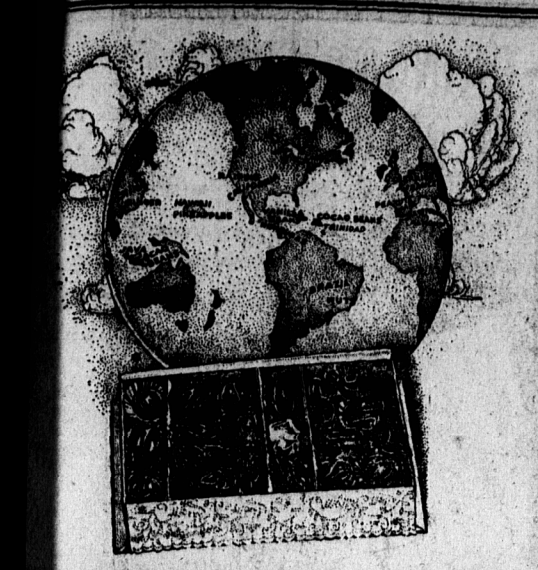
