Contract Bridge

THE BETTER CHOICE There were two possible lines of play for the slam contract in today's deal, but one had a distinct edge over the other.

South dealer. Both sides vulnerable. Match-point duplicate.

Hand analysis: ♠ Q43, ♥ QJ109, ♦ AKQ, ♣ 62. N: ♠ 8542, ♥ J1085, ♦ AKJ1085, ♣ A. W: ♠ 963, ♥ K73, ♦ 2, ♣ 9643. E: ♠ AKJ1085, ♥ A, ♦ A, ♣ K9343.

The duplicate game in which this deal occurred included a large number of good players, which was attested by the fact that every North-South pair reached a contract of six spades. This was a typical bidding sequence:

10-20B South West North East 1 ♠ Pass 2 ♣ Pass 4 ♠ Pass 5 ♠ Pass 6 ♠ Pass Pass Pass

At two tables the West player laid down the club ace, and after

that the declarers could "coast home." At four other tables, however, West opened the diamond jack, and this led to an immediate problem for the respective declarers. After great thought, three of them decided to play for the club ace to be on side, and therefore immediately led a club toward the king. As may be seen, these Souths came to immediate grief. Only one declarer figured out the most propitious line of play. After winning with the diamond queen, he cashed the diamond king and discarded his own ace of hearts! He then led the heart queen through East for a ruffing finesse. East, sensing the true situation, ducked the heart queen without hesitation but South had committed himself and therefore discarded a club. When the heart queen held, he led the jack through East, who now covered. South ruffed, cashed the ace and king of trumps, then led to dummy's trump queen. The established hearts let him discard three more clubs, and the diamond ace took care of South's last club. Thus, this South made his contract and an extra trick. Particularly because this was match-point duplicate, the heart play through East was better than the club lead toward the king, because the former had an equal chance to succeed and if it did succeed it would produce all thirteen tricks.
