—"FLORAL TRIBUTE.—The family of Benjamin A. Graham, regret that in his obituary notice the floral tribute sent by his sister, Mrs. Carrie Johnstone and family was omitted.

—"NEW MACHINERY INSTALLED.—The new wool carding and spinning plant at Souris, recently installed by Mr. Wm. Landrigan is now in full operation and the working of the complicated machinery and the product it is turning out is drawing the attention of a great many visitors and a large amount of patronage. The machinery is operated by a 25 H.P. Fairbanks Morse, crude oil engine. After the wool is treated with oil, it is put through a self-feeding, mixing and picking machine, having a capacity of 1,000 lbs. per hour, and weighing "spinner" or "mule," weighing 7,500 lbs., and capable of spinning 2,000 yards of yarn per minute. On this same floor with the "spinner" is the "skein reel" weighing 800 lbs., and "spooler," weighing 500 lbs., and the "twister" with a weight of 4,000 lbs., all requiring a floor space of 47 ft. by 20 ft. The working operations are under the supervision and capable management of Messrs. Siddall and Myatt, two expert wool-workers, from the Mainland, who installed the equipment, and who are very anxious that the work accomplished should prove satisfactory to Mr. Landrigan and his many patrons. Who may be assured of fair treatment and satisfaction.
