PREPARING FOR ROYAL WEDDING

LONDON, Oct. 2. (Special)—Although the Royal wedding of the Duchess of Fife and Prince Arthur of Connaught will not take place until October, preparations are already under way for the event. The Chapel Royal, which is always closed at this season, while the Royal family is in the north, is undergoing the necessary alterations for the ceremony. Before leaving London the Princess Royal and the Duchess of Fife planned the outlines for the procession, which will be all-British in material, although French models and modistes will be employed in its preparation.

Plate will not be lacking in the new household, the regiments with which the bridegroom is connected, and the tenants of the Royal estates contributing generously to this department of the entourage. To prevent embarrassing duplication, the Royal couple will be allowed some choice in family gifts. When the present King married the Royal couple

received nineteen pianos. Royal relatives will confine their presents largely to rare and virtually priceless jewels. Some of the members of the Royal family are said to have combined on a gift which will consist of a crown of diamonds in ducal strawberry leaves.

The ceremony will be a semi-state affair, the invitations being sent out by the Lord Chamberlain in the name of the Princess Royal. It is expected that the German Emperor, the German Crown and Princess, the King and Queen of Norway, the Crown Prince and Princess of Sweden, the King and Queen of Spain and all the members of the English Royal family will be present. The wedding breakfast will be served in St. James' Palace.

It is not expected that the Duke and Duchess of Kent, which undoubtedly will be the new title of the pair, will remain long in England, as it is anticipated that Prince Arthur will succeed his father as Governor-General of Canada.

PICTOU EXHIBITION LARGELY ATTENDED

PICTOU, September 30.—Under fairly good weather conditions, cloudy sky and cool north-west wind, the Pictou county exhibition opened today with an attendance of over 4,000, and 2,500 entries, the largest in its history. Principal Cumming, of Truro, opened the exhibition in a short speech, in which he referred to the progress of agriculture in Nova Scotia in the past and hope for the future.

GROWTH OF MANUFACTURING IN EIGHT YEARS.

Referred to the changes in eight years. Principal Cumming said that in that time the manufactures of Nova Scotia had increased from \$21,000,000 to \$64,000,000. The increase in manufacturing had meant an increase to the price of farm products. Eight years ago there were 160 agricultural societies in the province today there are 210. The government then gave \$10,000 to assist the societies. Today it gave \$15,000. The farmers of Nova Scotia had come to realize the value of manufacturing for the farm and had made great strides in dairying, for which the province was naturally adapted. There had been 30 per cent. increase this year over last in creamery output and there would by 50 per cent. increase next year over this. The farmer was coming into his own last year.

Also this is not a favorable year for agricultural exhibitions, there are 20 per cent. more exhibits at the Pictou exhibition this year than two years ago, and 25 per cent. more exhibitors.

THE EXHIBITION OF HORSES AND AGRICULTURE.

There is a large exhibition of horses, especially in the agricultural and roadster classes, and all pure breeds are shown except the thoroughbred. Some very fine heads of cattle are shown in Guernseys and Ayr-

shires and grades are exceptionally good. Sheep and pigs over-run the accommodation. There are 300 head of cattle and sheep. The fruit exhibit is large for a poor fruit year and good. Roots are not as large as usual, but there are some creditable exhibits over here. Women's work is always an attractive exhibit.
