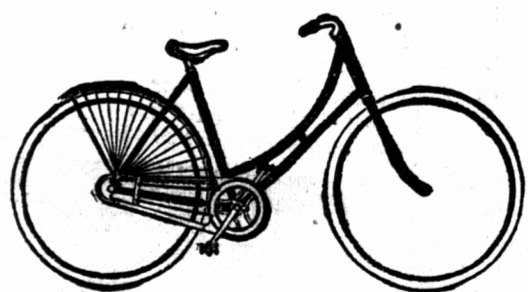

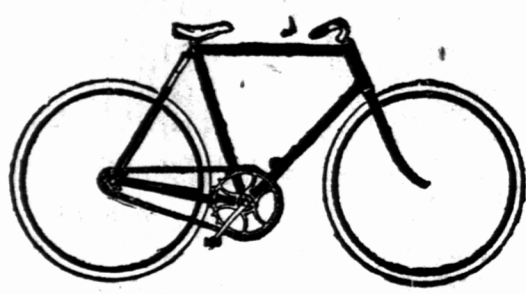

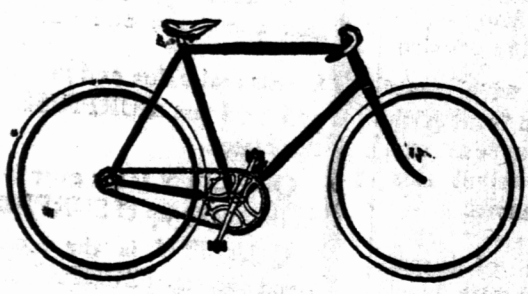

LAWLESS AND REVENGEFUL.

An incident recorded in our Summerside column of yesterday was the breaking of valuable windows in the stores of two firms, persons connected with which have been actively identified with the renewed effort to enforce the Canada Temperance Act. There is probably no doubt in anybody's mind that this act of vandalism was an act of revenge upon the firms referred to because they have given legal effect to their conscientious convictions, and carried out the platform upon which they were elected. It is quite safe to say that the outrage was not perpetrated by any one belonging to the temperance section of the community.

The rum trade is lawless and it tends to breed a lawless spirit in all who support it. Long years ago it became necessary to hedge in the traffic by sundry restrictions, and never yet was a restriction imposed that was not broken, not by the few merely, but by the many who have been engaged in the sale of intoxicants. They have persistently sold on days and hours that were forbidden, in places that were forbidden and to Indians and minors to whom they were forbidden to sell. When, instead of restriction, a prohibition of the sale is embodied in the law of the land, they still sell. If law-abiding citizens attempt to enforce the law, then resort is had to acts of violence, treachery and revenge.

This conduct is by no means confined to Summerside, or to Prince Edward Island. Acts of revengeful lawlessness against those who endeavor to enforce restrictive or prohibitory legislation have been painfully common in other Provinces of Canada and the States of American union. Persons have been assaulted, maimed and even killed, their windows broken and their houses blown up or burned, all for no other reason than that they sought to enforce the law of the land against lawless men and a lawless traffic.

The Summerside Councillors are deserving of every credit for their firm and energetic stand in favor of the enforcement of the Canada Temperance Act, and they are entitled to and we trust they are receiving the hearty and cordial support of all order-loving citizens. We greatly mistake them if they will be deterred from doing their duty by any acts of violence that the enemy may commit. It would be a great mistake to yield in any way to the system of terrorism which is always the last resort of the defeated rum party, and we feel confident that no such result is to be feared. On the contrary the present feeling is to continue the vigorous enforcement of the Scott Act and that no pains should be spared to discover and punish those guilty of the window-breaking crime. If necessary for the future security of persons and property, let a vigilance committee be formed to assist the officers of the law. It is necessary at such times that the orderly and law abiding portion of the community shall strongly assert its supremacy and make the law a real terror to evil doers. In the meantime the violent tactics of the rum party will tend to define more sharply the line of demar-

cation between those who stand for law and order and those who are lawless, and we doubt not will tend to strengthen the hands of the Council in its good work.

The Soulanges canal, recently opened for traffic, has been under construction for seven years past and cost \$5,250,000.

The Russian Government has adopted a captivating plan to secure immigration to the fertile regions of Siberia. For 743 roubles, about \$3.62, the immigrant will be given a ticket good for his transportation for a distance of about 4,000 miles into that vast country. But should he want to return he must first secure governmental permission and then pay full railway fare for the home trip.

Great preparations are making among the astronomers for observing the total eclipse of the sun on May 23. The path within which the eclipse will be total is a somewhat narrow one, beginning on the Pacific Ocean just west of Mexico, entering the United States near New Orleans, traversing the States of Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia, South Carolina, North Carolina, touching Virginia, and reaching the Atlantic at Norfolk and Cape Henry. On the other side of the Atlantic it will touch Portugal, Algiers and North Africa and end near the northern end of the Red Sea. The total eclipse will not last more than one minute and 40 seconds in any part of the United States.
