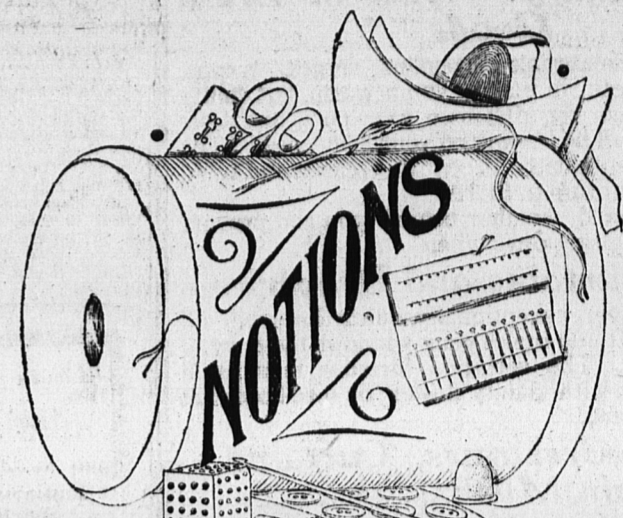
WANT COMMISSION AS PRICES TRIBUNAL
